

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$0.81591 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Falls County.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.81591 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.74788 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.81675 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2022 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Falls County from the same properties in both the 2021 tax year and the 2022 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Falls County may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Falls County is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2022 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON September 12, 2022 AT 9:00 AM AT Falls County Courthouse, County Court Room, 125 Bridge Street, Marlin, Texas 76661.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Falls County is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Falls County Commissioner's Court of Falls County at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

The following table compares the taxes imposed on the average residence homestead by Falls County last year to the taxes proposed to be imposed on the average residence homestead by Falls County this year.

No-New-Revenue Maintenance and Operations Rate Adjustments

Indigent Health Care Compensation Expenditures

The Falls County spent \$502,634 from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022 on indigent health care compensation expenditures at the increased minimum eligibility standards, less the amount of state assistance. For the current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent health care expenditures is \$376,295. This increased the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate by \$0.03282/\$100.

Indigent Defense Compensation Expenditures

The Falls County spent \$258,811 from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022 to provide appointed counsel for indigent individuals in criminal or civil proceedings in accordance with the schedule of fees adopted under Article 26.05, Code of Criminal Procedure and to fund the operations of a public defender's office under Article 26.044, Code of Criminal Procedure, less the amount of any state grants received. For the current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's indigent defense compensation expenditures is \$92,676. This increased the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate by \$0.00072/\$100.
