• **One (1) Drilling/Operating permit for High Prairie Holdings LLC:**

Well #1 (**BVDO-0430**): Located at: N 30.46077778° W 96.25258333° 1.34 miles S of the intersection of FM 2154 and High Prairie Road in Brazos County. Total maximum annual production from the water well is 100 ac-ft/yr at a maximum rate of 120 gpm for Agricultural use. The well produces from the Yegua-Jackson Aquifer.

• **One (1) Drilling/Operating permit for High Prairie Holdings LLC:**
