Llano State of the County

Austin, Texas - Llano County leadership and community stakeholders will have an opportunity to learn more about the growth trends of their area during a presentation on the State of Llano County, hosted by Judge Wayne Brascom and presented by the Capital Area Council of Governments (CAPCOG) on June 21st from 2-4 pm at the Kingsland Library in Kingsland. The State of the County presentations are a recent CAPCOG initiative with the purpose of providing county-specific information on demographic and economic trends that will help the county plan for the future.

The presentation includes information about population, income, housing, commuting patterns, jobs, and education and is developed to assist community leaders determine trends that may impact their infrastructure, economy, or quality of life on a long-term basis. At the request of any County Judge in the ten-county region, CAPCOG will prepare a State of the County report; Burnet and Hays Counties have participated in this project during the last year.

This project is part of the work CAPCOG does through its economic development program funded by the Economic Development Administration, U.S. Department of Commerce. CAPCOG also develops a regional economic development plan (Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy or CEDS) and provides direct support and technical assistance to member governments.
