

**MCCULLOCH COUNTY DECLARATION OF LOCAL DISASTER  
FOR PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, beginning on July 4, 2025, McCulloch County was under imminent threat of severe damage, injury or loss of life or property in relation to the torrential rains that fell in multiple areas within the County resulting in flood waters damaging homes, businesses, government buildings, destroying fences, damaging city and county roads; and

WHEREAS, due to these circumstances combined with the forecast of additional rain our County is facing a serious threat from this extremely dangerous, continuous flooding for our citizens, limited rescue capabilities, loss of utilities for homes, business and governmental buildings; and

WHEREAS, the McCulloch County Judge has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property and livestock;

THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE COUNTY JUDGE OF MCCULLOCH COUNTY THAT:

1. A local state of disaster is hereby declared for McCulloch County pursuant to 418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code; and
2. Pursuant to 418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code, this Declaration of a local state of disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven days from the date of this declaration unless continued or renewed by the Commissioners Court of McCulloch County.
3. Pursuant to 418.108(c) of the Government Code, this Declaration of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed with the County Clerk of McCulloch County.
4. Pursuant to 418.108(d) of the Government Code, this Declaration of the local state of disaster is declared to protect citizens, property, livestock, and other essential needs.

This Declaration shall take effect immediately from this date of issuance.
