Texas Voters Must Present an Acceptable Form of Identification

Voters are required to present an acceptable form of photo identification when voting in person in Texas.

Before heading to the polls, make sure you are **Vote Ready** and have an acceptable form of identification.

Acceptable Forms of Photo ID Include:

- **Texas Driver License** issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)
- **Texas Election Identification Certificate** issued by DPS
- **Texas Personal Identification Card** issued by DPS
- **Texas License to Carry a Handgun** issued by DPS
- **United States Military Identification Card** containing your photograph
- **United States Citizenship Certificate** containing your photograph
- **United States Passport**

*Except for the U.S. Citizenship Certificate, the identification presented must be current or have expired **no more than four years** before being presented at the polling place.

Do Not Have an Acceptable Photo ID?

If you do not possess an acceptable form of identification and cannot reasonably obtain one, you may complete a **Reasonable Impediment Declaration** at the polling location and present one of the following supporting documents:

- Valid voter registration certificate
- Certified birth certificate (must be an original)
- Copy of or original current utility bill
- Copy of or original bank statement
- Copy of or original government check
- Copy of or original paycheck
- Copy of or original government document that shows your name and address
(*Original required if it contains a photograph.*)



Exemptions

Some voters may qualify for an exemption from presenting identification at the polls.

Permanent Exemption

Voters with a disability may apply with the **Hopkins County Voter Registrar** for a permanent exemption.

Temporary Exemption

Voters may qualify for a temporary exemption if they:

- Have a religious objection to being photographed, or
- Do not have an acceptable form of identification due to certain natural disasters.
