Are You Registered to Vote?

Check Your Voter Registration Status

Before voting, make sure you are registered and that your voter registration information is current.

You can:

- Check your voter registration status
- Review voter eligibility requirements
- Learn how to register to vote
- Request voter registration forms

Please remember: **You must be registered to vote at least 30 days before Election Day to be eligible to vote in an upcoming election.**

What to Expect When Voting

The **Hopkins County Elections Office** uses secure electronic voting equipment at polling locations throughout the county.

When you arrive at the polling location, you will:

1. Present an acceptable form of identification.
2. Check in with Election Workers.
3. Receive the appropriate voting materials based on your eligibility for that election.
4. Review your ballot selections before submitting your ballot.
5. Cast your ballot using the voting equipment provided.

Where to Vote

Early Voting

During the Early Voting period, registered Hopkins County voters may vote at the designated Early Voting location.

Election Day Voting

Hopkins County participates in **Countywide Voting**, allowing registered voters to vote at any of the **13 Vote Centers** available throughout the county on Election Day.

Election Day Vote Centers are open:

7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.

Identification Requirements

When you arrive to vote, you will be asked to present an acceptable form of identification.

Acceptable forms of identification include:

- Texas Driver's License issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety
- Texas Election Identification Certificate
- Texas Personal Identification Card issued by DPS
- Texas Handgun License issued by DPS
- United States Military Identification Card containing your photograph
- United States Citizenship Certificate containing your photograph
- United States Passport

What to Expect at the Voting Booth

After your eligibility has been verified by Election Workers, you will be directed to a voting station where you can review and make your selections on the voting equipment provided.

Take your time reviewing your ballot before submitting it. Once your ballot is submitted, your vote is securely recorded.
