Your Voter Registration Certificate contains important information about your voter registration status and the districts and precincts where you are eligible to vote. Below is an explanation of the information listed on your certificate:

1. VUID (Voter Unique Identification Number)

Your VUID is your 10-digit statewide Voter Unique Identification Number assigned by the Texas Secretary of State's Office. This number remains the same as long as you are a registered voter in Texas, even if you move from one Texas county to another.

2. Precinct Number

Your voting precinct is determined by your residence address. Your precinct identifies the specific area where you are assigned to vote.

3. Certificate Expiration and Renewal

When your voter registration certificate expires, a new certificate will automatically be mailed to voters with active registrations.

4. Residence Address

This is the residential address you provided when registering to vote. Your voting precinct and the districts in which you are eligible to vote are based on this address.



5. Signature Requirement

Please sign your voter registration certificate upon receipt.

6. Political Party Selection (Primary Elections)

Texas voters do not register by political party. However, when voting in a primary election, you must request a ballot from the party whose primary you wish to participate in. Your selection will be recorded in this section of your certificate. This helps ensure you receive a ballot from the same party if a runoff election is required.

If you did not vote in the initial primary election but wish to participate in a subsequent runoff election, you may make your party selection at that time.

7. District Information

The districts listed on your voter registration certificate represent the areas in which you reside and determine the races for which you are eligible to vote:

- **US Rep** – United States Congressional District
- **State Senate and State Representative** – Texas Legislature Districts
- **Co. Comm.** – County Commissioner Precinct
- **J.P.** – Justice of the Peace District

8. Mailing Address

Your mailing address is the address you provided to the Hopkins County Elections Office for receiving election-related mail. Your mailing address does **not** determine your voting precinct, districts, or the races in which you are eligible to vote.
