## NOTICE OF MEETING TO VOTE ON TAX RATE

A tax rate of .3364 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of  
Cooke County

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2022  
(*current tax year*) tax year that will raise the same amount  
of property tax revenue for Cooke County  
(*name of taxing unit*) from the same properties in both  
the 2021  
(*preceding tax year*) tax year and the 2022  
(*current tax year*) tax year.

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that Cooke County  
(*name of taxing unit*) may adopt without holding  
an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Cooke County

proposing to increase property taxes for the 2022

A PUBLIC MEETING TO VOTE ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON August 22, 2022 at 10:00 am

The proposed tax rate is also not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Cooke County
