Sexual Assault Awareness Month, April 2026

WHEREAS, survivors of sexual violence often face significant physical, emotional, and psychological impacts, and deserve access to compassionate, confidential support and services; and

WHEREAS, Highland Lakes Family Crisis Center provides critical, survivor-centered services to individuals and families impacted by sexual assault, including advocacy, counseling, and crisis support; and

WHEREAS, Highland Lakes Family Crisis Center provided over 16,000 services to survivors in the past year, demonstrating the ongoing need for awareness, prevention, and support in our community; and


WHEREAS, increasing public awareness, promoting prevention, and fostering a community culture of respect and accountability are essential to ending sexual violence; and


