

**RESOLUTION NO. R26-149**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JOHNSON CITY, TEXAS, CANCELING THE MAY 2, 2026 GENERAL ELECTION DUE TO UNOPPOSED CANDIDATES; DECLARING EACH UNOPPOSED CANDIDATE ELECTED; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Johnson City (“City”) is a general law municipality located in Blanco County; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with state law, a general election has been ordered for May 2, 2026 for the purpose of electing three (3) Councilmembers; and

**WHEREAS**, no proposition is to appear on the ballot in the election; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Secretary has certified in writing that no person has made a declaration of write-in candidacy and that each candidate for each place on the ballot is unopposed for election to office; and

**WHEREAS**, the filing deadlines for placement on the ballot and declaration of write-in candidacy has passed; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 2.053(a) of the Texas Election Code authorizes the City Council to declare each unopposed candidate elected to office and to cancel the election.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JOHNSON CITY, TEXAS THAT:**

**SECTION ONE.** The foregoing recitals are adopted as facts and are incorporated fully herein.

**SECTION TWO.** The May 2, 2026 is hereby ordered cancelled.

**SECTION THREE.** The following candidates who are unopposed in the May 2, 2026 general election are hereby declared elected to office, and shall be issued a certificate of election:



**SECTION FOUR.** The City Secretary is directed to post a Notice of Cancellation of Election in accordance with the Texas Election Code and to provide a copy of this Resolution to the Blanco County Elections Administrator.


**SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
