**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** pursuant to Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code (the Texas Open Meetings Act) that a <u>Special</u> meeting of the Blanco County Commissioners Court shall be held on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 23</u>, <u>2021</u> at <u>9:00 a.m.</u> in the Commissioners Courtroom of the Blanco County Courthouse located at <u>101 E. Pecan Dr.</u>, <u>Johnson City</u>, <u>Blanco County</u>, <u>Texas</u>, and simulcasted live online at <u>www.YouTube.com</u>, channel "Blanco County", at which time the following subjects shall be discussed and action considered and/or taken thereon:

- 1. Call to order and roll call.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3. PUBLIC COMMENTS—opportunity for the general public to address the Court on any matter. Comments are limited to 3 minutes.
- 4. Consider approval of minutes of prior Commissioners Court meeting(s). Vote on any action taken. (Judge Bray)
- 5. Consider ratifying or approving line-item transfers as presented. Vote on any action taken. (Judge Bray)
- 6. Consider approval of the outstanding bills. Vote on any action taken. (Judge Bray)
- 7. Presentation of check by James Sultemeier, with Capital Area Housing Foundation, for the County to award to ESD 1 & 2 for the Community Paramedic Program. Vote on any action taken. (Judge Bray)
- 8. Consider authorization for the County Judge to sign updated agreement with Wastewater Transport Services for the quarterly pumping of the LEC grease trap. Vote on any action taken. (Judge Bray & Sheriff Jackson)
