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

### What is 4-H?

#### Scholarship

Each year, the Texas 4-H Youth Development Program awards an estimated \$2.2 million in scholarships to high school seniors. In 2017, 29 youth from the Central District 8 earned \$284,500 in scholarship money for advanced education.

The youth from Bosque, Comanche, Coryell, Ellis, Erath, Falls, Freestone, Hamilton, Leon, Limestone, McLennan, Milam, Robertson, and William-

son Counties are seeking advanced degrees in fields such as Pre-Dental, Global Studies, Interdisciplinary Studies, Business, Marketing, Food Science, Agribusiness, Agricultural Leadership & Development, Poultry Science, Mechanical Engineering, Bilingual Education, Culinary Arts, Social Work, Agricultural Economics, Agricultural Education, Business Management, Welding, Animal Science, Environmental Science, Kinesiology, Finance, Art Education, Psychology, Physics, Biomedical Sciences, Electrical Engineering, Eq-



uine Science, Public Health, Agricultural Communication, Pre-law, Electrical Power & Controls, Chemistry, Early Childhood Education, and Nursing. Upon completion of their advanced degrees, many of the youth have indicated they would like to return to give back to the communities that helped make their futures possible.

The Texas 4-H scholarship program began in 1959. At that time, the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo awarded youth with scholarships in the amount of \$1,000. Today the largest scholarship is \$20,000 presented by the San Antonio Livestock Exposition followed by \$18,000 from the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo.

In 2016, the scholarship program will celebrate 59 years of providing college scholarships to Texas 4-H members and continues to be the largest 4-H scholarship program in the United States.

# 4-H Project Work and Contests



4-H projects are the educational experiences in which youth who are 4-H members participate. A project is defined as consisting of 5-6 new learning experiences, leadership, community service, and exhibition of their project work. Youth engage in learning experiences through a variety of methods such as project meetings, workshops, tours, interviews, research, and more. All youth are encouraged to teach others about what they have learned to gain leadership skills and are also encouraged to help give back to their community. In addition, youth can engage in competitive events such as presentations, speeches, demonstrations, and/or

recordbooks. Adult volunteer leaders will help youth in setting and reaching their goals through their project work.

#### District 8 4-H SURGE (Leadership Lab)

The 4-H Youth Development Program prides itself on teaching leadership life skills to its youth members to grow into successful, contributing members of society in adulthood. One even that teaches and helps youth develop the life

skills of our 4-H members is District 8 4-H SURGE (formerly known as Leadership Lab). It is a three-day, two-night program targeted at 4-H members in grade 8-12. District 8 boasts of having the largest participation in the state for the last several years. Workshops this past summer included team work, trust, leadership discussions, problem solving, parliamentary procedure, how to make 4-H meetings more



fun, and getting started with Robotics. The workshops and activities were conducted by County Extension Agents as well as the District 8 4-H Council Officer Team under the direction of their agent advisors.



Another main component to SURGE is teaching youth the value of citizenship and service to their community. This year, camp youth went out into the local community and engaged in active community service projects. Projects included sorting through donated items at the Good Samaritan Ministries, assisting at a youth garden workshop at a community garden, leading younger students in activities at the Boys and Girls Club, visiting seniors to play games, read, and provide manicures at a nursing home, and

maintenance work at our camping facility. Some youth remained at the camp facility and conducted additional service projects such as making fleece tie blankets, writing letters to soldiers, making sleep mats with recycled materials, and hygiene kits to donate to homeless shelters.

# **Family & Consumer Sciences:**

Navarro County Passenger Safety Check Up Station Car seat checks are done monthly by appointment as needed. The Navarro checkup station averages between 2-4 installations/inspections per month. During the May 2018 community car seat event with Navarro Regional Hospital, 29 child safety seat inspections were conducted and 23 seats issued.

Do Well Be Well with Diabetes was held in partnership with the Lions Club in September with 7 participants. Classes were taught by professionals from The Health Department, WIC, YMCA and Walmart Pharmacy. Healthy recipes choices were demonstrated and sampled from the Dinner Tonight Essentials cookbook.

Better Living Texans program was offered to Navarro College adult education ESL classes, House of Refuge and Navarro Foster Grandparents Association. These venues had approximately 50 total participants and 32 graduates who participated in nutrition, food safety and shopping wisely education.

4H FCS Summer Programs For Adventure Camp we partnered with Liz Espie and Coryell County and toured local Corsicana businesses and then travelled to Canton for a campout and shopping trip. We visited with Two Feathers, a silversmith who gave a demonstration on jewelry making. We had 7 Navarro County participants. We partnered with HEB for the cake decorating camp and had over 30 participants.

Wine, Nutrition and Yoga Event was held at Angelita Vineyard with 16 participants. Dinner Tonight recipe tastings were paired with wine tastings for a healthier take on appetizers. A nutrition lesson along with the fitness benefits of yoga and a yoga class was taught.

Healthy County Flu Clinic and Brunch was held in October with HEB Pharmacy providing the shots at no cost to employees utilizing their insurance benefits. Approximately 70 employees received flu vaccinations and 15 received the new Shingles vaccination. Many others received the Pneumonia, TDAP, Hep B and Highdose flu vaccinations. Texas Associations of County representative Carrye Chen was present to discuss new insurance changes, benefits and fitness challenges for the 2018/2019 year.

Fall 2018 Walk Across Texas is in progress and has 56 participants and will finalize on November 18th.



# RESOLUTION NO. <u>2018</u> - 105

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF NAVARRO, TEXAS REESTABLISHING THE CURRENT TAX ABATEMENT POLICY GUIDELINES AND CRITERIA FOR GRANTING TAX ABATEMENT IN REINVESTMENT ZONES CREATED BY THE CITY OF CORSICANA, TEXAS OR OTHER AUTHORIZED TAXING JURISDICTION; ELECTING TO PARTICIPATE IN TAX ABATEMENTS; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code requires that a taxing unit adopt a resolution stating that it elects to become eligible to participate in tax abatement; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code requires cities, which elect to participate in tax abatement programs, to establish guidelines and criteria governing the designation of reinvestment zones and tax abatement programs prior to granting any future tax abatement; and

WHEREAS, to assure a common coordinated effort to promote economic development with the City of Corsicana, the Guidelines and Criteria should be adopted; and

WHEREAS, any tax incentives offered by Navarro County should be limited to those companies that create new wealth within the Navarro County; and

WHEREAS, Navarro County reestablishes the previous Tax Abatement Policy approved and adopted on November 14, 2016.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF NAVARRO COUNTY, TEXAS THAT:

### **SECTION 1.**

The Tax Abatement Guidelines, Criteria and Policy for the Navarro County, Texas attached hereto as Exhibit "A" is hereby reestablished as the guidelines and criteria governing tax abatement in Navarro County. The Tax Abatement Guidelines, Criteria and policy shall be effective for two (2) years from the date of this resolution, and may be amended or repealed by a vote of three-fourths (3/4) of the members of the Commissioners Court. The Commissioners Court hereby elects to participate in tax abatements.

### **SECTION 2.**

This resolution shall become effective upon passage.

# TAX ABATEMENT GUIDELINES, CRITERIA AND POLICY NAVARRO COUNTY, TEXAS

### SECTION 1. AUTHORITY, PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

- 1.01 Navarro County is committed to the promotion of high quality development in all parts of the County; and to ongoing improvement in the quality of life for its citizens. Insofar as these objectives are generally served by the enhancement and expansion of the local economy, Navarro County will, on a case-by-case basis, give consideration to providing tax abatement as stimulation for economic development in Navarro County. It is the policy of Navarro County to make available tax abatement for both new facilities and for the expansion or modernization of existing buildings or structures. For the purpose of establishing a policy on economic development incentives, and pursuant to Chapter 312 of the Texas Property Tax Code, Navarro County, Texas (hereinafter referred to as "County") is authorized to designate Reinvestment Zones and to enter into tax abatement agreements in all areas of the County.
- 1.02 Section 312.002 of the Texas Property Tax Code requires that the County establish guidelines and criteria governing tax abatement agreements. These guidelines and criteria are for the purpose of promoting the efficient and reasonably consistent administration of tax abatement incentives. These guidelines are effective for two (2) years from the date adopted by the Commissioners Court for Navarro County (hereinafter referred to as "Commissioners Court").
- 1.03 These guidelines and criteria, and the procedures established herein, do not:
  - a. Limit the discretion of the Commissioners Court to decide whether to enter into a specific tax abatement agreement,
  - b. Limit the discretion of the Commissioners Court to delegate to its employees the authority to determine whether or not the Commissioners Court should consider a particular application or request for tax abatement, and
  - c. Create any property right, contract right or other legal right to any person, or firm, or corporation to have the Commissioners Court consider or grant a specific application for a specific request for tax abatement.
- 1.04 The County is committed to the promotion of quality development in all parts of the County and to an ongoing improvement in the quality of life for its citizens. Insofar as these objectives are generally served by the enhancement and expansion of the local economy, the County will, on a case-by-case basis, give consideration to providing tax abatement as stimulation for economic development in the County. It is the policy on economic development incentives for the County that said consideration will be provided in accordance with the guidelines, criteria and procedures outlined in this document. Nothing herein shall imply or suggest that the County is under any obligation to provide any incentive to any applicant. All applicants shall be considered on a case-by-case basis.

### **SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS**

- 2.01 "Abatement" means the full or partial exemption from ad valorem taxes of certain real property values and/or tangible personal property values in a reinvestment or enterprise zone designated by the County for economic development purposes.
- 2.02 "Agreement" means a contractual agreement between a property owner and/or lessee and the County.
- 2.03 "Base Year" means the calendar year in which the abatement contract is executed (signed).
- 2.04 "Base Year Value" means the assessed value of eligible property January 1 preceding the execution of the agreement plus the value of eligible property improvements and Tangible Personal Property made after January 1, but before the execution of the Agreement, and which property is owned by the owner, co-owner, and/or its parent companies, subsidiaries, partners, co-venturers, or any entity exercising control over the owner or subject to control by the owner.
- 2.05 "Deferred Maintenance" means improvements necessary for continued operation which that do not improve productivity, or alter the process technology, reduce pollution or conserve resources.
- 2.06 "Eligible Facilities" or "Eligible Projects" means new, expanded or modernized buildings and structures, tangible personal property as defined in the Texas Tax Code, including fixed machinery and equipment, which is reasonably likely as a result of granting abatement to contribute to the retention or expansion of primary employment or to attract major investment in the reinvestment zone that would be a benefit to the property and that would contribute to the economic development within the County, including facilities which are intended primarily to provide goods and/or services to residents or existing businesses located in the County such as, but not limited to, restaurants and retail sales establishments. Eligible facilities may include, but shall not be limited to, industrial buildings and warehouses. Eligible facilities may also include facilities designed to serve a regional population greater than the County for medical, scientific, recreational or other purposes.
- 2.07 "Expansion" means the addition of buildings, structures, machinery, tangible personal property, equipment, payroll or other taxable value for purposes of increasing production capacity; and/or, a property previously undeveloped which is placed into service by means other than expansion or modernization.
- 2.08 "Modernization" means a complete or partial demolition of facilities and the complete or partial reconstruction or installation of a facility of similar or expanded production capacity. Modernization may result from the construction, alteration, or installation of buildings, structures, machinery, equipment, pollution control devices or resource conservation equipment.
- 2.09 "New Facility" means a property previously undeveloped which is placed into service by means other than in conjunction with Expansion or Modernization.
- 2.10 "Productive Life" means the number of years a property improvement is expected to be in service in a facility.

2.11 "Tangible Personal Property" means tangible personal property classified as such under state law, but excluding inventory and/or supplies and tangible personal property that was located in the investment or enterprise zone at any time before the period covered by the agreement with the County.

### **SECTION 3. REINVESTMENT ZONE DESIGNATION**

- 3.01 A Reinvestment Zone may only be designated in accordance with Subchapter B of Chapter 312 of the Texas Property Tax Code, as amended. The procedures set forth in this section apply to County-created reinvestment zones.
- 3.02 A Reinvestment Zone under § 312.201 of the Texas Property Tax Code may by ordinance be designated by the Commissioners Court, in an area of the County, that is found by the County to satisfy the requirements of § 312.202 of the Texas Property Tax Code.
- 3.03 An area may be designated as a Reinvestment Zone if the Commissioners Court, after a public hearing on the proposed designation, finds that the designation would contribute to the retention or expansion of primary employment within the County or would attract major investment in the Reinvestment Zone and would contribute to the economic development of the County.
- 3.04 A public hearing on the proposed Reinvestment Zone designation must be held prior to the findings and action of the Commissioners Court on the proposal. At this hearing, all interested persons are entitled to speak and present evidence for or against the designation. Not later than the seventh (7th) day before the date of the public hearing, notice of the public hearing shall be: (1) published in a notice in a newspaper having general circulation in the County, and (2) delivered in writing to the presiding officer of the governing body of each taxing unit that includes in its boundaries real property that is to be included in the Reinvestment Zone. The public hearing must also be posted as an agenda item on the Commissioners Court agenda to comply with the Tax Code and the Texas Open Meetings Act.
- 3.05 A delivered notice made under subsection 3.04 in the paragraph above is presumed to be delivered when placed in the mail, postage paid and properly addressed to the appropriate presiding officer. A notice properly addressed and sent by registered or certified mail for which a return receipt is received by the sender is considered to have been delivered to the addressee.
- 3.06 If the Commissioners Court finds that designation of the area as a Reinvestment Zone is proper, such proposed designation shall be put to a vote of the Commissioners Court, and will pass if a majority of the members of the Commissioners Court in attendance vote to approve the designation.
- 3.07 The ordinance of the Commissioners Court designating the area as a Reinvestment Zone (Zone) shall contain a description of the boundaries of the Zone and the eligibility of the zone for residential tax abatement, or commercial-industrial tax abatement, or tax increment financing as provided for in Chapter 311 of the Texas Property Tax Code.
- 3.08 The designation of the Reinvestment Zone may be for a period of up to five (5) years. No designation shall exceed five (5) years, and may be for a shorter period at the discretion of

the Commissioners Court. The designation shall automatically expire five (5) years after the date of the designation unless renewed by the Commissioners Court for subsequent periods not to exceed five (5) years each. Pursuant to § 312.203 of the Texas Property Tax Code, the expiration of the designation of a Reinvestment Zone does not affect an existing tax abatement.

- 3.09 Designation of an area as an Enterprise Zone under the Texas Enterprise Zone Act (Chapter 2303, Government Code) constitutes designation of the area as a Reinvestment Zone without further hearing or other procedural requirements other than those set out in the Texas Enterprise Zone Act.
- 3.10 Pursuant to § 312.002 and § 312.204(a) of the Texas Property Tax Code, the County may agree in writing with the owner of taxable real property that is located in a reinvestment zone, but that is not in an improvement project financed by tax increment bonds, to exempt from taxation a portion of the value of the real property or of tangible personal property located on the real property, or both, for a period not to exceed ten (10) years, on the condition that the owner of the property make specific improvements or repairs to the property.
- 3.11 Section 312.204(b) of the Texas Property Tax Code requires that the agreements made with the owners of property in a reinvestment zone contain identical terms for the portion of the value of the property that is to be exempt and the duration of the exemption.

### **SECTION 4. ABATEMENT AUTHORIZED**

- 4.01 Tax Abatement is authorized, subject to the approval of the Commissioners Court and execution of a lawful tax abatement agreement, for properties located within a Reinvestment Zone designated by the Commissioners Court or other authorized taxing jurisdiction.
- 4.02 <u>Authorized Facilities:</u> Tax abatement may be granted for new facilities and for expansion or modernization of existing facilities. The Productive Life of a facility or improvements must exceed the life of the tax abatement agreement.
- 4.03 <u>Eligible Property:</u> Tax abatement may be granted for Eligible Facilities or Projects and increased value to real property or tangible personal property to the extent allowed by state law.
- 4.04 <u>Value of Abatement:</u> Eligible Facilities may be granted abatement on all or a portion of the increased value of eligible property over the Base Year for a period to be determined by the Commissioners Court. Taxes may be abated for real property or improvements, to the extent that the value of the real property exceeds the value for the Base Year. Taxes on eligible Tangible Personal Property may be abated to the extent of additions, but cannot be abated for Tangible Personal Property located on the real property at any time before the period covered by the tax abatement agreement, and cannot be abated for inventory and supplies.

### **SECTION 5. CRITERIA FOR TAX ABATEMENT**

5.01 The following threshold criteria shall be used to determine whether any tax abatement incentives shall be considered:

- a. The project must create an investment of at least five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) in property improvements or in personal property must be made, not including purchase price of the land.
- b. At the discretion of the Commissioners Court, a partial (investment pro-rated) tax abatement may be granted in the event the project does not create a capital investment of at least five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) in property improvements or in personal property, but other threshold requirements must be met.
- c. The project must create at least fifteen (15) new, full time equivalent jobs (40 hours per week).
- d. A partial (employment pro-rated) tax abatement may be granted in the event the project does not create at least fifteen (15) new, full time jobs, but other threshold requirements must be met. The partial (employment pro-rated) tax abatement shall be calculated as a ratio of actual new, full time jobs created (numerator) and the threshold employment level (fifteen [15] new jobs) (denominator), multiplied by the percentage tax abatement granted for the capital investment and the creation of fifteen (15) new jobs.
- e. The project must obtain all required permits and meet all relevant planning and zoning requirements as applicable.
- 5.02 In addition to the minimum requirements stated above, the following subjective criteria shall be considered prior to granting any economic development incentive:
  - a. Is the project consistent with the preferred development or redevelopment of the County?
  - b. What types and cost of public improvements and services (roads, bridges, etc.) will be required of the County? What types and values of public improvements, if any, will be made by the applicant?
  - c. What impact will the project have on the local consumer and business communities?
  - d. How many full time jobs directly and indirectly are created by the Company?

### **SECTION 6. DISCRETION OF THE COUNTY**

- 6.01 It is the policy of the County to customize offers of economic development incentives on a case- by-case basis. The individualized design of a total incentive package is intended to allow maximum flexibility in addressing the unique concerns of each applicant while enabling the County to better respond to the changing needs of the community.
- 6.02 The criteria outlined in Section 5 above will be used to determine whether it is in the best interest of the County to provide any economic development incentives to a particular applicant. The degree to which the specified project furthers goals and objectives of the County and the relative impact of the specified project will be used to determine the total value of the

incentives provided. As a general rule, no tax abatement will be provided to any applicant in an amount exceeding the value of the following:

- a. No incentive shall be provided which abates taxes on real property or personal property by more than a total of five hundred percent (500%) over ten (10) years of the specific project (i.e., 50% level of abatement for a term of 10 years). For capital investments greater than \$500 million, the Commissioners Court may at their discretion, consider granting abatements up to a total of seven hundred percent (700%) over ten (10) years.
- b. An Eligible Project located within the boundaries of County that meets all tax abatement criteria stated herein is eligible for, but not entitled to, the maximum tax abatement.

### **SECTION 7. APPLICATION PROCEDURES**

- 7.01 Any developer desiring that the County consider providing economic development incentives to encourage location of an Eligible Project within the County shall be required to comply with the following application procedures and process. However, nothing within these guidelines shall imply or suggest that the County is under any obligation to provide any incentive to any applicant.
- 7.02 Applicant shall file an application for tax abatement (Exhibit 1) with the County which shall include at least the following information to be considered, if applicable, in the determination whether to grant tax abatement.
  - a. A cover letter on Company letterhead addressed to the County Judge from the Company signed by a corporate officer requesting tax abatement consideration by the Commissioners Court.
  - b. A survey plat showing the precise location of the property, all roadways proximate to the site, and all existing zoning (as applicable) and land uses proximate to the site.
  - c. A metes and bounds legal description of the property considered for designation as a reinvestment zone.
  - d. A completed Application for Tax Abatement consisting of the following data and information:
    - 1. Date of application;
    - 2. Name of firm, partnership, or corporation and mailing address;
      - (a) Previous tax abatement received from County (Yes/No):
      - (b) If previous abatement has been received, date it was received
    - 3. Number of new full time (40 hour work week) employees to be added;

- 4. Number of acres of property to be developed
  - (a) Plat of property and development or site plan attachment (Yes/No);
- 5. Estimated value of existing real property to be developed;
- 6. Estimated value of real property improvements;
- 7. Estimated value of existing inventory:
- 8. Estimated value of inventory to be added;
- 9. Estimated value of existing personal property;
- 10. Estimated value of taxable personal property improvements;
- 11. Total estimated value of taxable investment to be made;
- 12. Description of public services for project development and new facilities and/or services required;
- 13. Development schedule for all improvements;
- 14. Estimate impact on the local school district(s);
- Expected benefit to the local economy;
- 16. Estimated annual payroll of new employees;
- 17. Description or product to manufactured or distributed;
- 18. Expected Productive Life of all real property improvements;
- 19. Identification and quantity of all pollutants and emissions;
- Certification of no materially adverse environmental impact as a result of the improvements and operations;
- 21. Certification that project is compliant with relevant zoning requirements:
- 22. Declaration by company official with signature that all information provided is correct.
- 23. Reasonable proof of financial ability.
- 24. References from past communities, if applicable.
- e. An environmental compliance letter (Exhibit 2) addressed to the County Judge written on company letterhead and signed by a company official confirming that the proposed

project will fully comply with all requirements and regulations from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, and all local environmental requirements, regulations, and codes.

### **SECTION 8. ABATEMENT AGREEMENT**

- 8.01 Not later than the seventh (7th) day before the date on which the County enters into the tax abatement agreement (Agreement), the County shall deliver to the presiding officer of the governing body of each other taxing unit in which the property is located a written notice that the County intends to enter into the Agreement. The notice shall include a copy of the prepared Agreement.
- 8.02 The County shall formally pass a resolution authorizing the execution of an agreement with the owner (hereinafter referred to as Company). The Agreement shall contain at least:
  - a. The Base Year Value;
  - b. The percent of value to be abated each year;
  - c. The commencement date and the termination date of abatement;
  - d. The proposed use of the facility, property survey and property description, and list of property improvements;
  - e. Contractual obligations in the event of default;
  - f. A provision for access to and authorization for inspection of the property by County employees to make certain the improvements or repairs are being made according to the specifications and conditions of the agreement;
  - g. A provision for access to and authorization for inspection by appraisal district representatives for ad valorem property tax appraisal for all real property, improvements to real property, tangible personal property, inventory and equipment.
  - h. The limitations on the uses of the property consistent with the general purpose of encouraging development and/or redevelopment of the zone during the period that property tax exemptions are in effect;
  - i. A provision for recapturing property tax revenue lost as a result of the agreement in accordance with Section 9;
  - j. A provision that all permanent jobs be registered with the Texas Workforce Commission and that all contractors be encouraged to seek qualified workers through the Texas Workforce Commission:
  - k. Each and every term and condition agreed to by the County and the Company;

- A requirement that the Company certify annually to governing body of each taxing unit granting tax abatement is in compliance with applicable terms and conditions of the agreement; and
- m. All terms required by Texas Property Tax Code § 312.205, as amended, and any other terms deemed appropriate by the Commissioners Court.

### SECTION 9. RECAPTURE OF TAXES AND TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

- 9.01 The Commissioners Court shall have the authority to require recapture of all taxes abated in the event the Company violates any term or condition of the Agreement.
- 9.02 In the event that the facility is completed and begins operation as required by the Agreement, but during the term of the Agreement subsequently discontinues such operation, or fails to maintain property values as required by the Agreement, for any reason excepting fire, explosion, or other casualty or accident or natural disaster, then the Agreement may terminate and all taxes previously abated by virtue of the Agreement shall be recaptured and paid to the County within sixty (60) days of the termination.
- 9.03 In the event that the company or individual:
  - allows its ad valorem taxes owed the County or other affected jurisdiction to become delinquent and fails to timely and properly follow the legal procedures for their protest and/or contest; or
  - b. fails to make improvements or repairs as provided in the Agreement, the Agreement then shall be terminated and all taxes previously abated by virtue of the Agreement shall be recaptured and paid within sixty (60) days of the termination.
- 9.04 Should the County determine that the Company or individual is in default according to the terms and conditions of the abatement agreement, the County shall notify the company or individual, in writing, at the address stated in the agreement, and if such non-compliance is not resolved within sixty (60) days from the date of such notice, then the agreement shall be terminated.

### SECTION 10. AMENDMENTS TO THESE GUIDELINES AND CRITERIA


The guidelines and criteria adopted herein shall not be amended or repealed except by three-fourths (3/4th) vote of the Commissioners Court.

### **SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE**

These guidelines and criteria adopted herein shall be effective from the date of passage and remain effective for two (2) years from such date of adoption, unless otherwise repealed or amended by a three-fourths (3/4) vote of the Commissioners Court for the Navarro County, Texas.



A RESOLUTION OF THE NAVARRO COUNTY, TEXAS COMMISSIONERS COURT, APPROVING THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF AN AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN NAVARRO COUNTY, TEXAS AND CLEAN VISION SOLAR, LLC, FOR A COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL TAX ABATEMENT, AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION BY THE COUNTY JUDGE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Navarro County Commissioners have been presented a proposed tax abatement agreement between the Navarro County, Texas and Clean Vision Solar, LLC, providing for a property tax abatement for certain improvements, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (hereinafter called "AGREEMENT"); and

WHEREAS, upon full review and consideration of the AGREEMENT, and all matters attendant and related thereto, the County Commissioners are of the opinion that the terms and conditions thereof should be approved, and that the County Judge shall be authorized to execute it on behalf of the Navarro County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE NAVARRO COUNTY, TEXAS:

Section 1. The terms and conditions of the proposed AGREEMENT, having been reviewed by the Commissioners of Navarro County and found to be acceptable and in the best interest of Navarro County and its citizens, are hereby in all things approved.

Section 2. The County Judge is hereby authorized to execute the AGREEMENT and all other documents in connection therewith on behalf of Navarro County, substantially according to the terms and conditions set forth in the AGREEMENT.

Section 3. That this approval and execution of the AGREEMENT on behalf of Navarro County is not conditional upon approval and execution of any other tax abatement agreement by any other taxing entity.

Section 4. This Resolution shall become effective from and after its passage.

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### TAX ABATEMENT AGREEMENT

This Tax Abatement Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into by and between NAVARRO COUNTY, TEXAS, acting herein by and through its County Judge and hereinafter referred to as COUNTY, and Clean Vision Solar, LLC, hereinafter referred to as OWNER.

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of the COUNTY held a public hearing on the 22<sup>rd</sup> day of October 2018, and found that designation of the REINVESTMENT ZONE described below would contribute to the retention or expansion of primary employment, would attract major investment in the zone that would be a benefit to the property to be included in the zone and would contribute to the economic development of the COUNTY; and

WHEREAS, at the conclusion of the public hearing on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of October 2018, the Commissioners of the COUNTY passed Resolution No. \_\_\_\_\_ (the "Resolution") establishing Reinvestment Zone 18-101 (the "REINVESTMENT ZONE") in the COUNTY for commercial/industrial tax abatement as authorized by Chapter 312, Texas Tax Code; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has previously adopted a Tax Abatement Policy (the "Tax Abatement Policy") on November 14, 2016, stating that it elects to be eligible to participate in tax abatement; and

WHEREAS, the Tax Abatement Policy constitutes appropriate guidelines and criteria governing tax abatement agreements to be entered into by the COUNTY as required by Chapter 312, Texas Tax Code; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has sent written notice that it intends to enter into this Agreement, including a copy of this AGREEMENT, to the presiding officer of the governing body of each other taxing unit in which property to be subject to this AGREEMENT is located, as required by Section 312.2041 of the Texas Tax Code; and

WHEREAS, in order to maintain and/or enhance the commercial economic and employment base of the Navarro County area and for the long-term interest and benefit of the COUNTY, it is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the COUNTY that the COUNTY enter into this Agreement in accordance with the Resolution, the Tax Abatement Policy, and the Texas Tax Code; and

WHEREAS, OWNER currently has an exclusive, irrevocable option to lease the real property described by parcel identification number and by map on Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (the "Property") and contemplates constructing and locating certain Improvements (as defined in Paragraph 2.2 and Exhibit F) on the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Property and contemplated use of the Property and the contemplated Improvements to the Property in the amount as set forth in this Agreement, and the terms hereof are consistent with encouraging development of the REINVESTMENT ZONE in accordance with the purposes for the creation of the REINVESTMENT ZONE and are in compliance with the Tax Abatement Policy; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court finds that the Improvements are feasible and practical and would be of benefit to the land included in the REINVESTMENT ZONE

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits and promises contained herein and for good and other valuable consideration, the adequacy and receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

## I. DEFINITIONS

Whenever used in this Agreement, the following terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them:

- 1.1 "Certificate" means a letter, provided by the OWNER to the County, certifying that OWNER has completed construction of the Improvements and acquisition of the Tangible Personal Property, stipulating the overall nameplate capacity of the project. Upon receipt of the Certificate, the County may inspect the property in accordance with this Agreement to determine that Improvements and Tangible Personal Property are in place as certified.
- 1.2 "Estimated Tax Value" means the estimated depreciated Tax Net Book Values applicable to the Improvements and the Tangible Personal Property described in Paragraph 2.2 below, as scheduled on Exhibit "D" attached hereto and incorporated herein by. For reference purposes, the Estimated Tax Values scheduled on Exhibit "D" are determined using the Navarro County Central Appraisal District's appraisal guidelines in effect as of the date of this Agreement.
- 1.3 "Event of Bankruptcy or Insolvency" means the dissolution or termination of Owner's business as a going concern, insolvency, appointment of receiver to take possession of all, or substantially all, of Owner's assets and such appointment is not terminated within ninety (90) days after such appointment is initially made, any general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or the commencement of any proceeding under

any bankruptcy or insolvency laws by or against owner and such proceeding is not dismissed within ninety (90) days after the filing thereof.

- 1.4 "Force Majeure" means any contingency or cause beyond the reasonable control of OWNER including, without limitation, acts of God, war, riot; civil commotion, insurrection, severe adverse weather, governmental action (unless caused by acts or omissions of OWNER), fires; explosions or floods, or strikes.
- 1.5 "Personal Property" means, under Section1.04(4) of the Texas Tax Code all property that is not Real Property.
- 1.6 "Real Property" shall be defined as provided under Section1.04(4) of the Texas Tax Code.
- 1.7 "Tangible Personal Property" means tangible personal property as defined under Section 1.04(5) of the Texas Tax Code and hereafter located on the Property, but expressly excludes inventory and supplies, and any tangible personal property that was located at the Property at any time before the date of this Agreement.
- 1.8 "<u>Taxable Value</u>" means the taxable value as certified by the Navarro County Central Appraisal District in any given year.

Other terms defined elsewhere in this Agreement shall have the meanings therein ascribed to those terms.

### II. OWNER'S OBLIGATIONS

- 2.1 The property to be the subject of this Agreement shall be the Property described herein in Exhibit A and B, the Improvements and the Tangible Personal Property described in Exhibit F.
- The OWNER will construct and locate improvements to the Property ("the Improvements") and acquire the Tangible Personal Property, as described in Exhibit "F" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The Owner anticipates that construction of the Improvements will commence on or before July 1, 2019, and be completed by January 1, 2021. The Taxable Value of the Improvements and Tangible Personal Property will be a minimum of \$120,000,000.00. On or before January 1, 2021, OWNER shall create and fill a minimum of five (5) new, full-time jobs at the Property and OWNER shall maintain such jobs at the Property throughout the Term of this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing deadlines, OWNER may have such additional time to satisfy the obligations contained in this Paragraph 2.2 as may reasonably be required in the event of Force Majeure if OWNER is diligently and faithfully pursuing satisfaction of the applicable obligation. The date of substantial completion of the Improvements shall be defined as the date that the Certificate is received by the County Judge.

- 2.3 As good and valuable consideration for this Agreement, OWNER agrees and covenants that it will diligently and faithfully pursue the completion of the Improvements in a good and workmanlike manner. OWNER further covenants and agrees that all construction of the Improvements and use of the Property will be in accordance with all applicable State and local laws, codes, and regulations (or valid waiver thereof). In further consideration, OWNER agrees and covenants that it will continuously use and occupy the Property as a solar power generation facility, and operate and maintain such facility, from the date of the Certificate until expiration of the Term of this Agreement.
- OWNER further agrees that the COUNTY, its agents and employees shall have a right of access to the Property, upon not less than ten (10) days prior written notice, to inspect the Improvements in order to ensure that the construction of the Improvements is in accordance with this Agreement and all applicable State and local laws and regulations (or valid waiver thereof). After completion of the Improvements, the COUNTY shall have the continuing right to inspect the Property, upon not less than ten (10) days prior written notice, to ensure that it is being maintained, operated and occupied in accordance with this Agreement throughout the Term, as defined below, of this Agreement. In addition, the OWNER agrees that Navarro County Central Appraisal District representatives shall have a right of access to the Property, upon not less than ten (10) days prior written notice, for the purpose of ad valorem property tax appraisal for all of the Property, the Improvements, Tangible Personal Property and (if subject to such property taxes) the Personal Property.
- 2.5 OWNER agrees that it will register all permanent jobs with the Texas Workforce Commission and that all contractors shall be encouraged to seek qualified workers through the Texas Workforce Commission.

# III. ABATEMENT OF TAXES

3.1 Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and subject to the rights of holders of any outstanding bonds of the COUNTY, a portion of ad valorem taxes from the Property and Improvements and a portion of taxes for Tangible Personal Property in place at the Property on January 1° of each year, that are otherwise owed to the COUNTY, shall be abated. Said ad valorem property tax abatement shall be for a ten (10) year term and shall apply to the taxes assessed upon the increased value of the eligible Property, after installation of the Improvements described in Paragraph 2.2, over the value of the Property in the year in which this Agreement is executed; and said Tangible Personal Property and Improvements tax abatement shall be for a ten (10) year term and shall apply to the taxes assessed upon the increased value of the eligible Tangible Personal Property and Improvements contemplated in Paragraph 2.2, over the value of in place Tangible Personal Property and Improvements in the year in which this Agreement is executed; all subject to, and in accordance with, the terms of this Agreement, the Tax Abatement Policy, Chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code, and all

applicable state and local regulations (or valid waiver thereof). The percentage (%) level of tax abatement for both Property, and Improvements and Tangible Personal Property during the foregoing ten (10) year terms shall be as described below in "Table 3.1, Tax Abatement Schedule."

The tax abatement for Tangible Personal Property will apply only to the Tangible Personal Property added to the Property after this Agreement is executed. Notwithstanding the forgoing, the OWNER shall have the right to protest and/or contest any assessment of the Property, Improvements and/or Tangible Personal Property over and above \$120,000,000.00.

- Said tax abatement(s) shall extend for a period of ten (10) years, as applicable, to the Property, the Improvements and the Tangible Personal Property, with such tax abatement beginning with the tax year on January 1, 2021, and shall remain in effect during the Term of this Agreement as long as the OWNER (a) constructs Improvements and acquires Tangible Personal Property with a minimum Taxable Value of \$120,000,000.00 as contemplated under Paragraph 2.2; (b) maintains minimum Taxable Values for the Improvements and the Tangible Personal Property each year during the Term of this Agreement at least equal to the Estimated Tax Values for each item as scheduled on Exhibit "D"; (c) creates and maintains a minimum of five (5) new, full-time jobs at the Property; and (d) otherwise satisfies all of the terms, conditions, and obligations of this Agreement.
- 3.3 It is understood and agreed among the parties that the Property, Improvements and Tangible Personal Property shall be appraised at market value to determine the Taxable Value for the purposes of the applicable real and personal property tax

assessments effective as of January 1, 2021, and continue to be appraised at market value to determine the taxable value thereof until the expiration of the Term of this Agreement.

### IV. TERM OF THE AGREEMENT

- 4.1 The term of this Agreement (the "Term") shall begin on the date of this Agreement and end upon completion of the final tax abatement year.
- 4.2 Prior to October 1st of each year during the Term of this Agreement, OWNER shall provide sufficient information to certify to the governing body of the COUNTY and each taxing unit in which the Improvements are located that OWNER is in compliance with all of the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

# V. DEFAULT AND RECAPTURE OF ABATED TAX

- 5.1 Owner shall be in default under this agreement if (a) OWNER fails to create the minimum Taxable Value of at least One Hundred twenty million and no/100 dollars (\$120,000,000) for the Improvements and Tangible Personal Property, as contemplated under Paragraph 2.2 and for which a tax abatement has been granted, or the Improvements otherwise are not completed, or the Tangible Personal Property not otherwise acquired, in accordance with this Agreement; (b) OWNER fails to maintain throughout the Term of this Agreement minimum Taxable Value for the Improvements and Tangible Personal Property at least equal to the Estimated Tax Value for each item as scheduled on Exhibit "D"; (c) OWNER fails to create and maintain throughout the Term of this Agreement a minimum of five (5) new, full-time jobs at the Property; (d) OWNER allows its ad valorem taxes owed to the COUNTY or any other taxing jurisdiction in which the Improvements are located to become delinquent and fails to timely and properly follow the legal procedures for protest and/or contest of any such ad valorem taxes; (e) OWNER has an Event of Bankruptcy or Insolvency (as defined in Paragraph 1.3); or (f) OWNER otherwise fails to comply, in any material respect, with any of the terms, conditions, or obligations of this Agreement.
- In the event of default, COUNTY shall give the OWNER written notice of such default and, if the OWNER has not cured such default within sixty (60) days after receipt of such written notice, this Agreement may be terminated by the COUNTY. If the COUNTY terminates this Agreement due to OWNER default, OWNER shall repay to the COUNTY all taxes which otherwise would have been paid to the COUNTY without the benefit of tax abatement during the Term of this Agreement, together with interest at the statutory rate for delinquent taxes as determined by Section 33.01 of the Texas Tax Code (but without the addition of penalty), reasonable attorney's fees, and costs of collection. Such amounts shall be due, owing, and payable to the COUNTY within sixty (60) days after the expiration of the above mentioned 60-day cure period.

The parties acknowledge that COUNTY will suffer damages in the event of OWNER's default under this Agreement. The COUNTY may pursue any additional legal rights and remedies to which it is entitled. OWNER's obligation to pay any amounts hereunder shall survive termination of this Agreement.

5.3 It is expressly acknowledged and agreed between the parties that the COUNTY shall have the right to place a tax lien against the Property pursuant to Section 32.01 of the Texas Tax Code. Such lien shall secure the payment of all taxes abated and subject to recapture under this Agreement, together with all other amounts payable hereunder. Any such lien may be fully enforced pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Tax Code. Also, to collect any amounts payable hereunder, the COUNTY shall have all other remedies provided generally in the Tax Code for the collection of delinquent property tax.

### VII. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 6.1 The COUNTY represents and warrants that the Property does not include any property that is owned by a member of the Commissioners Court approving, or having responsibility for the approval of this Agreement.
- 6.2 The terms and conditions of the Agreement are binding upon the successors and permitted assigns of all parties hereto. This Agreement may not be assigned by OWNER without the prior written consent of the COUNTY, such consent to be at the sole discretion of the COUNTY; provided, however, that upon written notice to the COUNTY, OWNER may assign its rights under this Agreement to a wholly owned subsidiary of OWNER, subject to OWNER remaining liable for all obligations hereunder.
- 6.3 It is understood and agreed between the parties that the OWNER, in performing its obligations hereunder, is acting independently, and the COUNTY assumes no responsibility or liability in connection therewith to third parties and OWNER agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the COUNTY of and from any claims or liabilities asserted against the COUNTY arising out of this Agreement or the Improvements, except for any such claims or liabilities resulting from the activities, omissions, negligence (whether ordinary, gross or intentional) and/or willful misconduct of the COUNTY, including the appraisal district, or any employee, contractor, agent or other representative of the COUNTY, including the appraisal district.
- Notices required to be given to any party to this Agreement shall be given personally or by certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, addressed to the party at its address set forth below, and given by mail, shall be deemed delivered as of the date personally delivered or three days after deposit in the United States mail:

Any party may change the address to which notices are to be sent by giving the other party written notice in the manner provided in this Paragraph.

- 6.5 This Agreement constitutes the entire and final expression of the agreement of the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement can be modified or amended only by a written agreement executed by both parties.
- This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to its choice of law rules. This Agreement is performable in Navarro County, Texas. Exclusive venue for any litigation related to, or arising out of, this Agreement shall lie in Navarro County, Texas.
- 6.7 In this Agreement, time is of the essence.
- 6.8 This Agreement may be executed simultaneously in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 6.9 This Agreement was authorized by resolution of the County Commissioners at a regularly scheduled meeting on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of October 2018, authorizing the County Judge to execute the Agreement on behalf of the COUNTY.
- 6.10 This Agreement was entered into by Clean Vision Solar, LLC, pursuant to authority granted by its Directors/Members/Owners on the 23 day of 2018.
- 6.11 This Agreement shall constitute a valid and binding agreement between the COUNTY and OWNER when executed in accordance herewith, regardless of whether any other taxing unit executes a similar agreement for tax abatement.



# Navarro County Personnel Policy For the Texoma H.I.D.T.A. Personnel ONLY!

Employees that are funded through the HIDTA program and assigned on a full time basis in support of this program are funded on a year to year basis and employees must sign a letter of acknowledging these positions would be eliminated if the federal HIDTA funding were terminated. These positions will accrue leave according to the following schedule and terms.

### Leave, Overtime & Holiday Policy:

Advance Leave must be approved by the Texoma HIDTA Director and may not exceed the amount to be earned during that calendar year. Upon termination of an employee, any unused Annual Leave earned for that year will be paid or any advance leave will be deducted from the final paycheck.

### **Annual Leave and Sick Leave:**

2B-3 Annual leave will be earned and credited per pay period, in an amount equivalent to the Federal employee leave schedule for years of service:

Less than 3 years = 104 hours per year 3 - 15 years = 160 hours per year More than 15 years = 208 hours per year

Annual leave must be used by the end of the calendar year, unless extended by written approval of the Texoma HIDTA Director. To take Annual or Compensatory leave, a Leave Request form must be filled out and signed by the employee, and approved by his/her supervisor.

2B-5 Sick leave may be accumulated from year to year. Sick leave will be earned and credited per pay period, in the amount equivalent to the Federal employee leave schedule of 104 hours per calendar year. Unused sick leave at the time of employee termination will be lost. Any sick leave used over 16 hours per pay period will require a memo of explanation be submitted with the Time Sheet. A Doctor's receipt may be requested by the Supervisor. Any abuse of sick leave may result in employee termination. A Doctor's Release will be required for employee to return to work after absence due to surgery.

Leave must be taken in minimum 30 minute increments.

### Holiday Pay:

2B-7 Paid holidays will be provided on the same schedule as the Federal Government.

### Overtime:

2A-12 No overtime will be authorized for staff employees.

### **Compensatory Time:**

2A-3 Compensatory Time may be awarded in lieu of overtime pay, at a rate of one-and-one-half hours per hour worked, and is intended for special projects and Supervisor assigned duties (not at the discretion of the employee). Compensatory Time must be approved in writing in advance by the Supervisor, on the Leave Request Form. The actual hours worked should be noted on the monthly Time Sheet. Accumulated compensatory time must be used prior to use of any annual leave.
