RE: Court-Appointed Fees & Procedure for Payment (effective April 5, 2010)

After much consideration of the Court's budget, the depressed state of Navarro County's economy, the additional cases being filed through the Texas Youth Commission, as well as the increasing number of indigent individuals on the Court's docket, the Court issues the following fee schedule. This fee schedule will also be incorporated into the new indigent plan which will be released very soon. Each bill submitted must contain the attached Attorney Fee Voucher. The Attorney Fee Voucher must be submitted at the time of the disposition of the case so appropriate orders may be issued. The Court understands this will not always be possible when your case has been through a trial process. The Court asks that you submit your invoice within seven days of disposition.

Criminal Pleas:	\$400 (\$300 for a 2 nd case, \$200 for a 3 rd case, \$100 for each subsequent case)
Criminal Revocation:	\$200 (\$100 for each subsequent case)
Juvenile Pleas:	\$300 (\$100 for each subsequent case)
Juvenile Modification:	\$100

In order to compensate for additional time spent on criminal, juvenile, and CPS cases, the Court will consider additional compensation when accompanied by an itemized statement on your office letterhead attached to the Attorney Fee Voucher.

Out-of-Court Preparation:	\$50 an hour
Hearings:	\$50 an hour
Trial:	\$75 an hour
Appellate:	\$75 an hour
Capital:	\$100 an hour
