Summary

The Appellate chief is primarily responsible for assisting the Liberty County District Attorney's Office with handling legal matters through the appellate process, including but not limited to direct appeals, writs of mandamus, post-conviction writs of habeas corpus, jury charges, and expunctions/non-disclosures. Given the skillset of the candidate, this position may include civil asset forfeiture and a small trial caseload.

Major duties include:

- Handles all aspects of criminal appellate prosecution including writing of briefs, writs of mandamus, and responses to post-conviction writs of habeas corpus.
- Providing legal advice to trial prosecutors including the ability to conduct quick and accurate legal research for trial prosecutions.
- Prepare and present oral arguments to the courts of appeals.
- Preparation of jury charges.
- Handle all aspects of expunctions and non-disclosure requests which includes but is not limited to filing answers, reviewing orders from applicants, and attending both contested and uncontested hearings.
- Participates in training activities.
