You can receive free VA health care for up to 10 years after discharge or release for any condition related to your service in Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) in Afghanistan or Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) or Operation New Dawn (OND) in Iraq. This is called an enhanced eligibility period.

More Than a Date: Reflecting on Service and Sacrifice in Liberty County This Memorial Day

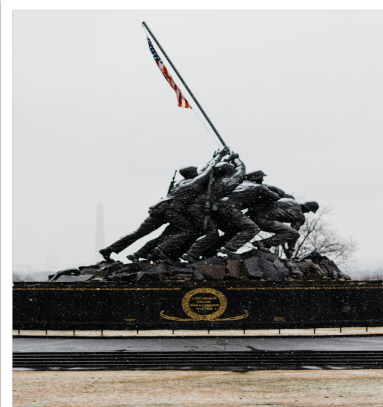

Words of Wisdom

In the current era, information is vast, incredible, and readily accessible. Individuals of all ages can now access this information from virtually any platform, including smartphones, emails, specific social media platforms, and television advertisements. Consequently, the flow of news and stories is abundant.

However, the abundance of information does not necessarily imply its veracity. Many veterans are exposed to numerous purported news articles that all claim to be beneficial for their well-being. These articles cover various topics, such as debt forgiveness and matters that may or may not have originated from the current administration. These issues are of significant concern to all veterans and could easily cause alarm if the news were troubling.

While an automatic filter to eliminate false stories would be beneficial, its implementation may be costly and limited. Therefore, to mitigate the stress associated with discovering inaccurate information, here are some helpful suggestions that can assist you in navigating through this vast amount of information.

1. Verify where the information came from. This could be accomplished by seeing if the information came from a direct source, or if the information is available from a trusted source. For example: There was an article stating that veterans are eligible for \$35,000 for compensation and pension benefits monthly. One of the first questions one should ask is where did this information come from? Did it come from the VA or VA representative through normal means of communication?
2. Ask the question: Who does the author appeal to? Do they appeal to or follow certain traditions? In other words, if the author of that same article appeals to the codes, rules, and standards permitted by the VA, then the information would more than likely be true. Most of this kind of verification could be found during the first investigation listed above.
3. Ask, "Is it True?" Just because the article or advertisement states "all veterans," ask is it true, do they truly mean "all veterans." From various rules, we should be very aware that at times and due to some character of discharge differences, this will prevent some benefits. Therefore, the idea that all veterans was vocalized means that they are not truly being forthcoming with or not as knowledgeable as what they believe.
