An LEPC is a partnership between citizens, local government and industry to enhance hazardous material preparedness. LEPCs are mandated organizations that consist of citizens, emergency responders, industry, government, education, media, and community groups.

LEPCs were established to carry out the requirements of the federal Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA) and related regulations for emergency response planning. EPCRA helps to provide notification and access to information on chemicals at individual facilities, their uses and releases into the environment.

LEPC provides joint emergency planning, training and public outreach throughout the LEPC's coverage area. As a result, communities working with industry are better able to protect public health and the environment.
