State Criminal Justice Mandate (counties)

The Gaines County Auditor certifies that Gaines County has spent \$171,657 in the previous 12 months for the maintenance and operations cost of keeping inmates sentenced to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. Gaines County Sheriff has provided Gaines information on these costs, minus the state revenues received for the reimbursement of such costs. This increased the no-new-revenue tax rate by 0.001367 /\$100.

Indigent Health Care Compensation Expenditures (counties)

The GAINES COUNTY spent \$422,126 from July 1 2024 to June 30 2025 on indigent health care compensation procedures at the increased minimum eligibility standards, less the amount of state assistance. For current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent health care expenditures is \$10,735. This increased the no-new-revenue tax rate by 0.000239 /\$100.

Indigent Defense Compensation Expenditures (counties)

The GAINES COUNTY spent \$173,824 from July 1 2024 to June 30 2025 to provide appointed counsel for indigent individuals in criminal or civil proceedings

in accordance with the schedule of fees adopted under Article 26.05, Code of Criminal Procedure, less the amount of any state grants received. For current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent defense compensation expenditures is \$11,012. This increased the no-new-revenue tax rate by 0.000181/\$100.
