- 1. Call to order, prayer, pledge
 - The Judge called the meeting to order with a prayer and pledges of allegiance.
- 2. Public Comment on scheduled agenda items

- 3. Discuss routine administrative items: take action as appropriate;
 - a. Payroll
 - b. Budget amendments and fund transfers

- Commissioner Houston made a motion to authorize Forza to supply the cool down stations, porta potties, hand washing stations and trash trailers at the Gaines County Park for the 4th of July Celebration as presented Morgan Guffy. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.
- 5. Consider approving tournament requests for the Golf Course; take action as appropriate None
- 6. Consider approving replacement of flooring at the Health Dept and Mental Health Building; take action as appropriate
 - Commissioner Murphree made a motion to approve 4T Industry to replace the flooring at the Health Department and Mental Health Building in the amount of \$34,500.00. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)
- 7. Hear from the County Treasurer to discuss information concerning the 457 Roth IRA plan conversion and update from First Basin Credit Union; take action as appropriate
 - Michael Lord, Treasurer, discussed investments with a better rate of return, streamlining and updates regarding the 457 Roth IRA plan and update from First Basin Credit Union. No action taken.
- 8. Consider accepting a gift of 500 gallons of confiscated diesel from the Comptroller's Office and the City of Seminole; take action as appropriate
 - Commissioner Murphree made a motion to accept a gift of 500 gallons of diesel that was fraudulently obtained from Allsups 2106, WTG Fuels, Inc as they cannot accept fuel back into their inventory. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

 - Commissioner Murphree made a motion to authorize the purchase of a 2021 Loader from Warren Cat in the amount of \$224,550.00 for Precinct 3. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)
- 10. Consider making a gift of a bobtail water truck from Precinct 3 to the Seminole Volunteer Fire Department; take action as appropriate
 - Commissioner Murphree made a motion transfer a 1994 Mack water truck, Unit #3088, from Precinct 3 to the Seminole Volunteer Fire Department. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

 - Commissioner Murphree made a motion to accept the bid from N.D. White Engineering Services, Inc. in the amount of \$21,500.00 to provide NEBB certified testing and rebalancing to rebalance

 Judge Keyes called the meeting to order with a prayer and pledges of allegiance.
- 2. Public Comment

- 3. Discuss routine administrative items: take action as appropriate;

- 4. Meet with Sheriff to receive update on purchase of replacement fleet vehicles; take action as appropriate
 - Ronny Pipkin, Sheriff, stated the new Dodge Rams for \$32,000 per vehicle that had previously been approved by court to purchase for the deputies are no longer available. He stated he had found 5 Ford Interceptors at Holiday Ford with a cost of \$34,900 per vehicle. Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve the purchase of the 5 Ford Interceptors for the Sheriff's office. Commissioner Houston seconded the notion. Motion carried unanimously.
- 5. Meet with Sheriff to consider approving an intragovernmental agreement with Garza County for inmate housing; take action as appropriate
 - Ronny Pipkin, Sheriff, stated Garza County Law Enforcement Center had increased their rate to house prisoners for Gaines County from \$45 to \$55. Commissioner Murphree made a motion to approve the Intergovernmental Agreement with Garza County as presented by Ronny Pipkin, Sheriff. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)
- 6. Receive update on purchase of John Deere utility tractor for Precinct 1; take action as appropriate
 - This item is tabled, Commissioner Rosson stated they sent a 4 wheel drive and he was purchasing a 2 wheel drive.
- 7. Consider authorizing the transfer of a pickup from Precinct 3 to the Maintenance Department with transfer of funds from Maintenance to Precinct 3; take action as appropriate
 - Commissioner Murphree, Precinct 3 stated Nick Castillo, Maintenance, had requested the purchase of a 2021 Pickup on next years budget. Commissioner Murphree made a motion to approve the transfer a 2021 Chev. 4 door pickup to maintenance and take their older pickup for Precinct 3 and transfer funds from maintenance to Precinct 3. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)
- 8. Consider approving switching all AT&T phone service and most of Windstream service to Spectrum; take action as appropriate
 - Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve Scott Shortes, IT Director, to switch all AT&T phone service to Spectrum for \$1,700.13 a month with the first 3 months free. Commissioner Houston seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)
- 9. Consider approving a request by the SPPHD to update their IT services with AT&T in their Seminole clinic
 - Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve the SPPHD to update their IT services with AT&T in the Seminole clinic. Commissioner Rosson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

 Judge Keyes stated Delia Grisham requested a county credit card to purchase items for the
 Juvenile Probation Character Camp. Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve issuing
 Delia Grisham, Juvenile Probation, a county credit card. Commissioner Houston seconded the
 motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)
- 11. Consider approving renewal of the service agreement for the generators at the jail; take action as appropriate
 - Commissioner Rosson made a motion to approve the renewal of the service agreement from Clifford Power for the generators at the jail in the amount of \$2,182.00. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

No action taken. Following much discussion Judge Keyes stated he had researched and talked with Chuck Kimbrough, Attorney, regarding the proper language needed to change our policy of guaranteeing 30 years of water supply. He stated once he has the proper language and the paperwork prepared he would present to the court for approval.

Commissioner Murphree made a motion to approve a variance less than 1 acre on 112 CR 318M from Aaron Thiessen to Peter Neufeld. Commissioner Houston seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

Commissioner Houston made a motion to approve a road crossing on CR 421 for Suddenlink in Precinct 4. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

Judge Keyes stated he met with a Vendor regarding replacing all the window coverings in the courthouse. They recommended not using miniblinds and going with Roller Shades with a cost of \$24,762.05. Judge Keyes stated he would put on the next agenda for approval.

Michael Lord, Treasurer, stated he needed to get approval to accept the rate increase on insurance from Blue Cross & BlueShield and requested this item to be placed on the next agenda.

Scott Shortes, IT Director, stated the upgrade from Serra to Office 365 would take place in August.

Susan Murphree, District Clerk, stated the need to have her part time employee become fulltime. Following much discussion this item was tabled until the next budget session.

Patricia Robertson, Elections Administrator, stated the Governor had signed a Bill requiring a paper trail on all election equipment. Therefore, she requested \$135,953.00 for Hart Intercivic to come in and upgrade all equipment. Commissioner Rosson made a motion to approve to pay Hart \$135,953.00 to upgrade election equipment out of reserve funds. Commissioner Belt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. (see attached)

Erin Snodgrass, Agrilife/Extension, stated she would not require the budget item requiring the purchase of a new Tahoe.

b. Discuss proposed holiday schedule for FY 22

Commissioner Belt made a motion to approve the 2022 Holiday Schedule as presented.
