This notice concerns the 2024 property tax rates for Colorado County
(current year) (taxing unit's name)

This notice provides information about two tax rates used in adopting the current tax year's tax rate. The no-new-revenue tax rate would impose the same amount of taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. In most cases, the voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate a taxing unit can adopt without holding an election. In each case, these rates are calculated by dividing the total amount of taxes by the current taxable value with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

Taxing units preferring to list the rates can expand this section to include an explanation of how these tax rates were calculated.

Voter-Approval Tax Rate Adjustments

State Criminal Justice Mandate

The Colorado County Auditor certifies that Colorado County has spent \$ 105,361 *(minus any amount received from state revenue for such costs)* in the previous 12 months for the maintenance and operations cost of keeping inmates sentenced to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. Colorado County Sheriff has provided Colorado County information on these costs, minus the state revenues received for the reimbursement of such costs. This increased the voter-approval tax rate by \$.000580 /\$100.

Indigent Health Care Compensation Expenditures

The Colorado County spent \$ 34,812 from July 1 2023 to Jun 30 2024 on indigent health care compensation procedures at the increased minimum eligibility standards, less the amount of state assistance. For the current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent health care expenditures is \$ 0. This increased the voter-approval tax rate by \$ 0 /\$100.

Indigent Defense Compensation Expenditures

The Colorado County spent \$ 292,018 from July 1 2023 to June 30 2024 to provide appointed counsel for indigent individuals, less the amount of state grants received by the county. In the preceding year, the county spent \$ 230,378 for indigent defense compensation expenditures. The amount of increase above last year's indigent defense expenditures is \$ 61,640. This increased the voter-approval rate by \$.000334 /\$100 to recoup the increased expenditures or 26.76% more than the preceding year's expenditures *(use preceding year's expenditures as a percentage of the increased expenditures, or 5% more than the preceding year's expenditures)*
