

Expunctions

Governed by Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Chapter 55, an expunction is the legal process for the removal and destruction of arrest and court records. Eligibility for this remedy is not automatic and is strictly defined by the specific circumstances of your arrest and case.

The following is a list of agencies normally involved in the expunction process. This contact list is provided as a convenience. You are **NOT** required to include every agency on this list. **DO NOT** include agencies who do not have records related to your case. Please include the physical or mailing and email address of each agency in your petition. Duplicate agencies will not be notified. **No “issue expunction-certified mail” fee is required in you include the agency’s email address in the petition/order.**

This list is not all-inclusive. You should include any outside agency that has published your information concerning the charge/arrest. **For each agency you include that does not have an email address, you must pay \$25 for the “issue expunction-certified mail” fee, which includes mailing of the notice and order.**
