This letter addresses the Fiscal Year 2013 implementation of the County Assistance Program defined under the rules of TAC Title 43, Part 1, Chapter 29, Subchapter A, Rule § 29.3 (43TAC. § 29.3), the Local Government Assistance Program and the new Rider 19 to the appropriation bill, House Bill number 1 (HB1) which passed the 82nd Legislative session.

Transportation Code § 201.706 which passed by the Texas Legislature in 1997, requires the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) to assist counties with materials to repair and maintain county roads damaged by the impact of 2060 Weight Tolerance permits. In addition, the legislation requires that a preference should be made for counties with the most Weight Tolerance permits and a maximum usage should be made of State surplus materials.

To administer this program each county is given a specific allocation to be provided by the respective districts. Allocations are determined based on a county's percent of statewide Weight Tolerance permits, the county's percent of the statewide county road vehicle miles and the county's percent of the statewide lane miles of county roads. TxDOT Districts will notify each county of the assistance available to them. Each county desiring material should make a written request to their TxDOT District Coordinator. TxDOT will also set and account for the value of the materials to insure compliance with state law.

During the recent 82nd Legislative Session, Rider 19 was also authorized. Rider 19 allows TxDOT to provide expert advice to cities related to roadway maintenance issues. In addition, if <u>after</u> satisfying the County Assistance Program, State surplus materials are still available, this material may be distributed to either cities or counties. Unlike the County Assistance program, the Local Government Assistance program prohibits the purchase of new materials. Only surplus material will be available for distribution under this program.

Requests for material to be distributed in accordance with House Bill 1 and Rider 19 during fiscal year 2013 should be submitted in writing within 45 days of the date of this letter. The written request should be submitted to: Texas Department of Transportation Attn. Michael Stroope, P.E., 3901 East Highway 80, Odessa, TX 79761-3522. Material allocations not requested by Winkler County within the 45 day timeframe will be made available to other counties. The amount allocated to Winkler County for Fiscal Year 2013 is \$12,498.00.

FCC NARROWBANDING RULES

ENFORCEMENT BUREAU REMINDS PRIVATE LAND MOBILE LICENSEES AND EQUIPMENT MANUFACTURERS OF THE JANUARY 1, 2013 DEADLINE FOR TRANSITIONING TO NARROWBAND TECHNOLOGY

To promote the efficient use of private land mobile radio (PLMR) spectrum and to facilitate the introduction of advanced technologies, the Commission has adopted rules requiring certain PLMR licensees and manufacturers to transition from wideband technology (i.e., systems using 25 kHz of bandwidth) to narrowband technology (i.e., systems using 12.5 kHz or narrower bandwidth) by January 1, 2013. The FCC's Enforcement Bureau is issuing this Enforcement Advisory to remind all private land mobile radio licensees operating in the 150-174 MHz and 421-470 MHz frequency bands (VHF/UHF bands)² that they must migrate their systems to narrowband technology by January 1, 2013. The Bureau also reminds manufacturers (subject to the limited exceptions noted below) that they must cease manufacturing and importing equipment that is capable of 25 kHz mode operation in the VHF/UHF bands by the narrowbanding transition deadline.

What must private land mobile licensees operating in the VHF/UHF bands do as of January 1, 2013?

- Operate on 12.5 kHz (11.25 kHz occupied bandwidth) or narrower channels, or
- Employ narrowband-equivalent technology, i.e., a technology that achieves the narrowband equivalent of at least one channel per 12.5 kHz of channel bandwidth for voice and transmission rates of at least 4800 bits per second per 6.25 kHz for data systems operating with bandwidths greater than or equal to 12.5 kHz.
- PLMR licensees are not required, at this time, to modify their licenses to remove wideband emission
 designators. However, the presence of a wideband emission designator on a license does not authorize
 operation after January 1, 2013 that does not comply with the narrowbanding standards.

² In April 2012, the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau and Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau waived, on their own motion, the narrowbanding requirement for licensees in the 470-512 MHz band. See Implementation of Sections 309(j) and 337 of the Communications Act of 1934 as Amended, Order, WT Docket 99-87, DA 12-642 (OET, PSHSB, WTB) (rel. Apr. 26, 2012). The waiver applies only to frequencies in the 470-512 MHz band. Therefore, licensees that operate in the 470-512 MHz band and the 150-174 MHz or 421-470 MHz bands must meet the narrowbanding transition deadline with respect to their frequencies below 470 MHz.

What are manufacturers required to do as of January 1, 2013? Except under certain limited circumstances, equipment manufacturers may no longer manufacture and import previously-certified equipment capable of operating with only one voice path per 25 kHz of spectrum in the 150-174 MHz or 421-470 MHz bands.³

What if private land mobile licensees or manufacturers need more time? The Commission has long emphasized its commitment to the January 1, 2013 deadline for migration to narrowband technology. PLMR licensees or manufacturers that anticipate the need for additional time beyond the January 1, 2013 deadline to complete the narrowbanding of their systems or to bring their equipment into compliance with the equipment certification rules, respectively, must request a waiver. However, requests for waivers of the deadline will be subject to a high level of scrutiny under the waiver standard set forth in Section 1.925 of the Commission's rules.

What are the penalties for failure to comply with the January 1, 2013 deadline? The Enforcement Bureau is committed to aggressively enforcing the narrowbanding transition deadline and violators may be subject to enforcement action. Penalties for non-compliance may include license revocation, and/or monetary forfeitures of up to \$16,000 for each such violation or each day of a continuing violation, and up to \$112,500 for any single act or failure to act.⁷
