# Notice About 2021 Tax Rates

Property Tax Rates in Hill County. This notice concerns the 2021 property tax rates for Hill County. This notice provides information about two tax rates used in adopting the current tax year's tax rate. The no-new-revenue tax rate would Impose the same amount of taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. In most cases, the voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate a taxing unit can adopt without holding an election. In each case, these rates are calculated by dividing the total amount of taxes by the current taxable value with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

# **State Criminal Justice Mandate**

The Hill County County Auditor certifies that Hill County County has spent \$231,626 (minus any amount received from state revenue for such costs) in the previous 12 months for the maintenance and operations cost of keeping inmates sentenced to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. Hill County County Sheriff has provided Hill County information on these costs, minus the state revenues received for reimbursement of such costs. This increased the voter-approval tax rate by \$195819.000000/\$100.

# **Indigent Health Care Compensation Expenditures**

The Hill County spent \$33,956 from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021 on indigent health care compensation procedures at the increased minimum eligibility standards, less the amount of state assistance. For the current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent health care expenditures is \$16,508. This increased the voter-approval tax rate by \$0.000000/\$100.

# **Indigent Defense Compensation Expenditures**

The Hill County spent \$389,902 from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021 to provide appointed counsel for indigent individuals, less the amount of state grants received by the county. In the preceding year, the county spent \$449,058 for indigent defense compensation expenditures. The amount of increase above last year's indigent defense expenditures is \$-59,156. This increased the voter-approval rate by \$0.000000/\$100 to recoup the increased expenditures.
