**HEALTH INSPECTOR/ SANITARIAN (NON-LICENSED)
ECTOR COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT**

The Ector County Health Department is in need of a Health Inspector (Sanitarian in training). The Health Inspector will be under the supervision of the Chief Sanitarian. This is a basic entry-level position to become a Professional Sanitarian, this person is required to complete study and acquire certification as a Professional Sanitarian within one year of employment with Ector County.

PRIMARY DUTIES: Under the direct supervision of the Chief Sanitarian, conducts routine environmental health inspections and performs technical work in the investigation of environmental health. Work also involves specialization in areas of food-borne and water-borne illness investigations. Conducts inspections in food and retail establishments utilizing Hazard Analysis of Critical Control Point (HACCP) program, pools and spas. Investigates public health nuisances, complaints, and all food-borne and water-borne illness.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with at least 30 semester hours in basic and/or natural science or any combination thereof, minimum of one (1) year experience in Environmental sanitation, ability to type 35 wpm and have a valid Texas driver's license with an insurable driving record.

SALARY: \$17.85 - \$18.57/hr DOE with benefits; Workdays & hours: Monday-Friday; 8:00am-5:00pm with occasional weekends
