ECTOR COUNTY MEDICAL EXAMINER'S OFFICE**

The Ector County Medical Examiner's Office has an opening for a Medical Examiner Investigator. The Medical Examiner Investigator will work under the supervision of the Medical Examiner and the Medical Examiner Chief Investigator.

**PRIMARY DUTIES:** Conduct on-scene medico legal investigation of death, collect and submit evidence, work closely with law enforcement, medical community, funeral homes, Medical Examiner's Office staff and law enforcement agencies. Scene photography and report writing is required as well as assisting with removal of deceased persons from scenes, requiring an ability to assist in the lift and carry of those persons. Some court testimony necessary. Will perform all other duties assigned by the Medical Examiner or Medical Examiner Chief Investigator.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:** High school diploma or equivalent is required with a valid Texas Driver's License with an insurable driving record. Prefer one of the following – three years' experience in law enforcement as a peace officer, crime scene investigator, or crime scene technician with separation from previous department in good standing; or a certified Paramedic, RN, or LVN with 3 years' experience; or equivalent of an Associate Degree in criminal justice, forensic science, bio-medicine or other related fields.

**SALARY:** Up to \$23.65-26.60 p/h DOE with excellent benefits. Work days & hours: 8:00am-5:00p.m. w/ rotating shifts, shift work and weekends.
