

Provide proof of service (such as DD214)





AS A STUDENT VETERAN YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR FREE MEALS?

Meals for Vets is a program that provides student veterans who have low income with DISCREET, free daily meals.

Getting through school is hard enough without the stress of not knowing if you'll be able to afford to eat. Meals for Vets and Mom's Meals have partnered up to make sure you get discreet delivery of 10 Fresh Meals every two weeks, delivered to your residence.

To qualify:

- Must have served at least 180 days federal active duty
- Provide proof of service (such as DD-214)
- Provide proof of all household income and benefits
- · Meet low income qualifications

A relatively new non-profit organization now offers access to one free nutritious meal a day for surviving spouses of Veterans living in Texas. Located in Fredericksburg, Meals For Vets feeds Texas Veterans and their family members who are in need, where-ever they are located. Their dedicated staff and volunteers are Veterans or have a Veteran family connection working as a team serving Texas Veterans – wherever they live in the state – they have them covered!

Their unique mission addresses food insecurity with Veterans and surviving spouses who are 59 years old and younger, or those older Veterans who have been placed on a meal provider's wait-list due to lack of federal funding. Some Veterans or their surviving spouses live outside a meal provider's service area, are homebound, or have dietary restrictions. They cover all of them, too.

Meals For Vets is funded by the Texas Veterans Commission, private foundations such as the Meadows Foundation and the M.S. Doss Foundation, businesses, and individual contributors who generously support their mission. Meals For Vets also serves student Veterans and surviving spouses at universities, colleges and trade schools. They currently serve thirty-eight schools throughout the state.

Referrals come from other Veterans, their families, VA social workers, County Veteran Service Officers, and school Veteran Representatives. In appropriate cases where Meals For Vets can't help, they refer the Veteran to other appropriate support organizations for assistance.

The goal of Meals For Vets is to help eliminate hunger among Veterans in Texas and they do that – one meal at a time – wherever the Veteran is located. That's their story.
