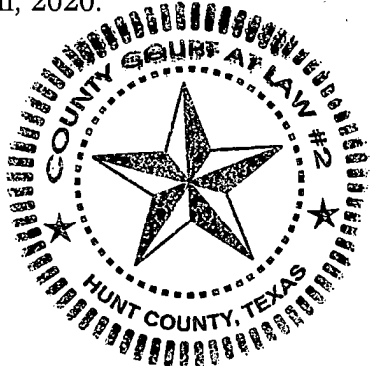

**APPLICATION TO PROBATE WILL AND
FOR ISSUANCE OF LETTERS OF INDEPENDENT ADMINISTRATION
PURSUANT TO SECTION 401.002(b) OF THE TEXAS ESTATES CODE**

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Arthur McCray ("Applicant"), furnishes the following information to the Court in support of this Application for the Probate of the Will of Frieda Branom ("Decedent"), and for issuance of Letters of Independent Administration pursuant to Section 401.002(b) of the Texas Estates Code:

1. Applicant Arthur McCray is an individual interested in this Estate, being domiciled in and residing in Virginia. Arthur McCray's address for service of citation is 807 Rugby Road, Charlottesville, Virginia 22903. The last three digits of the social security number of Arthur McCray are 129. The last three digits of the driver's license number of Arthur McCray are 724.

2. Decedent died on February 26, 2020, at Commerce, Hunt County, Texas, at the age of 103 years. Decedent's domicile at the time of her death was Commerce, Hunt County, Texas. The last three digits of the social security number of Decedent are 996. The last three digits of the driver's license number of Decedent are 032.

3. This Court has jurisdiction and venue is proper because Decedent was domiciled in Texas and had a fixed place of residence in this County on the date of her death.

4. Decedent owned property described generally as real estate, cash, personal effects and household goods of a probable value in excess of \$10,000.00.

5. Decedent left a valid Will dated December 18, 2013, which was never revoked. The Will will be delivered to the County Clerk pursuant to the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure.

6. The Will was made self-proved in the manner prescribed by law and the subscribing witnesses to the Will are Sandra Johnson and Edith Harrison.

7. After the date of the Will, no child was born to or adopted by Decedent.

8. No marriage of the Decedent was ever dissolved after the will was made.

9. The following state, governmental agency of the state, or charitable organization is named by the Will as a devisee:

Name: First Presbyterian Church of Commerce, Texas
Address: 1216 Monroe Street, Commerce, Texas 75428

10. A necessity exists for the administration of the estate, specifically the collection of assets, payment of debts, and distribution of the remaining estate, including the transfer of real property.

11. Decedent's Will nominated her sister, Emily Geraldine Branom, to serve as Independent Executrix. However, Emily Geraldine Branom predeceased the Decedent. Decedent's Will then nominated John Edward McCray as alternate Independent Executor to act independently. However, John Edward McCray is unable and unwilling to serve. Attached hereto is an affidavit of John Edward McCray declining to serve as executor.

12. Because Administrator Arthur McCray resides in Virginia, he has appointed David Carwell who resides at 1309 Aldridge Street, Commerce, Hunt County, Texas 75428, as the resident agent.

13. There exists a necessity for administration of the Estate, all of the Distributees agree on the advisability of having an independent administration and also agree that Arthur McCray should be appointed Independent Administrator without bond. The Distributees therefore request that no action shall be had in the county court at law in relation to the settlement of the Decedent's estate other than the probating and recording of the Will and the return of an inventory, appraisalment and list of claims of the estate, or an affidavit in lieu of the inventory, appraisalment and list of claims. Arthur McCray is not disqualified by law from serving as such or from accepting Letters of Administration, and would be entitled to such letters.

14. John McCray, Arthur McCray, First Presbyterian Church of Commerce, Texas and Juillard School of Music are the distributees of the Estate and are the only persons required to receive notice under Section 401.004 of the Texas Estates Code. John McCray, Arthur McCray, First Presbyterian Church of Commerce, Texas and Juillard School of Music will each file a Distributee's Consent to Application for Independent Administration and Waiver of Notice. An independent administration of the Decedent's estate pursuant to Section 401.002(b) of the Texas Estates Code is advisable and in the best interests of the Decedent's estate and of the heirs and distributees of the Decedent's estate.

WHEREFORE, Applicant prays that citation with respect to this Application to Probate Will and for Issuance of Letters of Independent Administration pursuant to Section 401.002(b) of the Texas Estates Code be issued and served as required by law to all persons interested in this Estate; that the Will be admitted to probate; that it be adjudged to be advisable and in the best interests of the Decedent's estate for Arthur McCray to be appointed to serve as Administrator under the Will and under the provisions of Section 401.002(b) of the Texas Estates Code; that

Letters of Independent Administration be issued to Arthur McCray that grants Arthur McCray full power and authority to take possession of Decedent's property, wherever it may be found, and to sell and partition, lease, encumber, or otherwise dispose of or convert any or all of Decedent's property to settle Decedent's estate, as Independent Administrator, when qualified according to law; and that no action be had in this court in relation to the settlement of such estate other than the probating and recording of such Will and the return of an inventory, appraisement, and list of claims of such estate, or an affidavit in lieu of the inventory, appraisement and list of claims; and that all other Orders be entered as the Court may deem proper.

COUNTY OF HUNT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

I, Frieda Branom of Hunt County, Texas, being of sound mind and memory, and desiring to so provide for the disposition of my estate that there may be no confusion concerning the same after my death, do hereby make, declare and publish this, my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all wills by me at any time heretofore made.

I.

I will and direct that at the time of my death I be given a Christian like funeral suitable to my circumstances and station in life.

II.

I will and direct that all my just debts be paid out of my estate by my Independent Executrix herein named, as soon as deemed convenient to do so by said Independent Executrix, but with as little delay as possible.

III.

I nominate and appoint my sister, Emily Geraldine Branom, Independent Executrix of this, my Last Will and Testament, and direct that no bond or other security be required of her as such, and that the courts take no further action hereon than to admit this will to probate and record.

In the event that my sister, Emily Geraldine Branom, should fail, refuse or become unable to serve as Independent Executrix of my estate as herein provided, then I hereby appoint my nephew, John Edward McCray, as Independent Executor of this, my Last Will and Testament, and direct that no bond or other security be required of said Independent Executor as such and that the Courts take no further action hereon than to admit this will to probate and record.

I will and bequeath all of the property, both real and personal, I may die seized and possessed of, of whatsoever kind and wheresoever situated as follows, to-wit:

1. I give, devise, and bequeath to the First Presbyterian Church of Commerce, Texas, the sum of \$5,000.00 for the care and maintenance of the church organ.
2. I give, devise, and bequeath to the Julliard School of Music in New York City, New York, the sum of \$5,000.00.
3. I give, devise, and bequeath to Frances Robinson, a friend, the sum of \$5,000.00.
4. All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, both real and personal of whatsoever kind and wheresoever situated which I may own or have any interest in at the time of my death, I give, devise and bequeath unto my sister, Emily Geraldine Branom, in fee simple forever.
5. In the event my sister, Emily Geraldine Branom, should predecease me, then I will and direct that all of the property herein bequeathed to Emily Geraldine Branom shall pass and vest in my nephews, to-wit: William Arthur McCray and John Edward McCray, share and share alike.

V.

I further authorize my hereinabove named Independent Executrix/Executor, at the discretion of said Independent Executrix/Executor, to sell any and all property which I may have or own at the time of my death and to convert same into cash for whatsoever price and upon whatsoever terms as said Independent Executrix/Executor may see fit, and following payment of all my debts, to divide the estate as hereinabove set forth, or to divide the estate in kind.

VI.

I further direct that the law firm of SMITH McDOWELL GINN of Sulphur Springs, Texas, handle the probate and administration as well as tax matters pertaining to my will and estate.

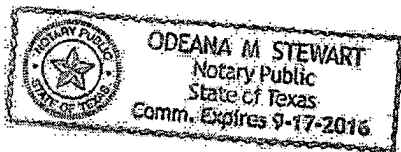
