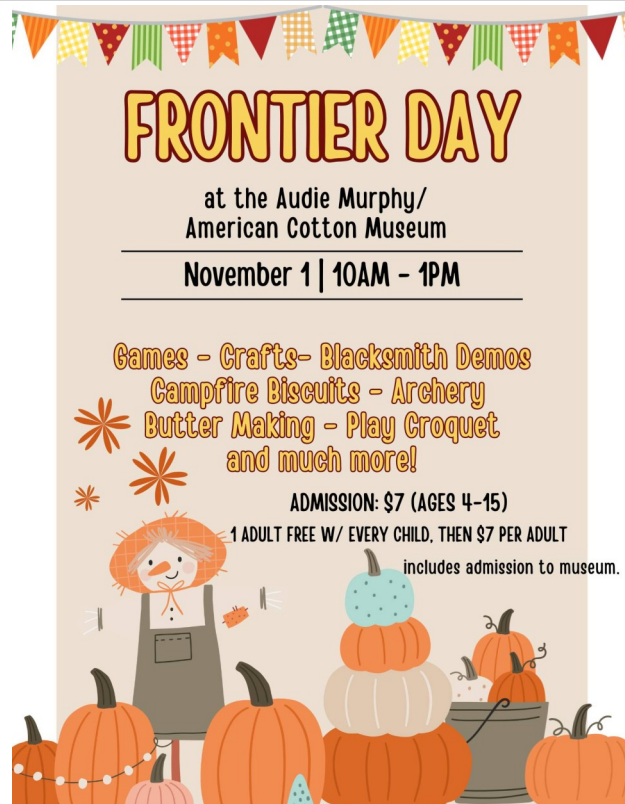

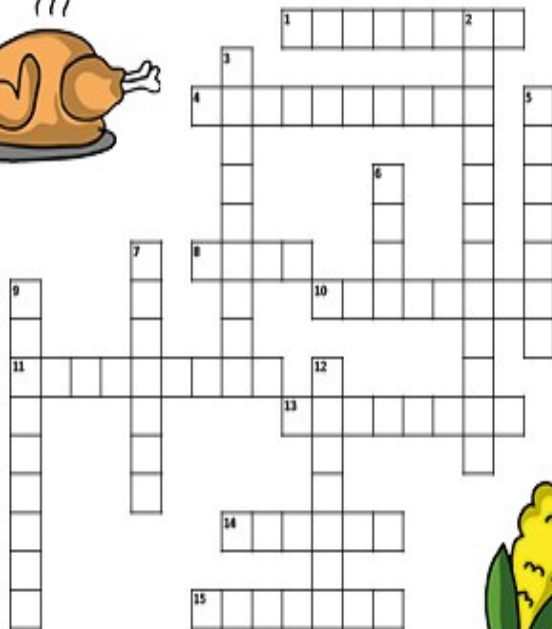

Another sign of Fall is Daylight Savings Time ends, when you **"fall back" an hour on Sunday, November 3rd!** For some, the time change doesn't affect our health, while others may feel tired and irritable. Here are (5) five tips to help make the forthcoming time change go easily.

1. Go to bed and get up the same time.
2. Practice good habit before bedtime.
3. Keep dinnertime consistent.
4. Go get more light.
5. Take a short cat nap.

Many Americans believe that changing the clocks is an outdated procedure with more negative than positive results. According to a 2022 CBS News Poll, 46% of U.S. residents preferred daylight saving time all year around, a later sunrise and sunset. In March 2022, the U.S. Senate passed legislation to make daylight saving time permanent, but unfortunately it did not pass the U.S. House of Representatives. Therefore, the Sunshine Protection Act expired in December 2022. So, for now, **please remember to change your clocks on Sunday, November 3rd at 2:00 a.m.!**

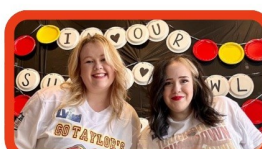
