Texas Influenza Awareness - October 2024 What You Need To Know About Flu

Flu is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat, and sometimes the lungs. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death. The best way to prevent flu is by getting a flu vaccine each year.

Flu Symptoms

Influenza (flu) can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death. Flu symptoms usually come on suddenly. People who have flu often feel some or all of these symptoms:

- · fever* or feeling feverish/chills
- cough
- · sore throat
- · runny or stuffy nose
- muscle or body aches
 - headaches
- fatigue (tiredness)

some people may have vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults.

*It's important to note that not everyone with flu will have a fever.

Who is eligible to receive ASN vaccine?

- Any adult aged 19 years or older who is uninsured is eligible to receive ASN Vaccines.
- ⇒ Adults with medical insurance, including Medicare or Medicaid, are not eligible to receive ASN Vaccines.
- Adults who are underinsured (Have insurance that does not cover immunizations) are not eligible to receive ASN Vaccines.
