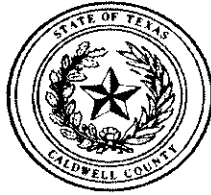

Discussion/Action to continue the Local Disaster Declaration ordered by the Caldwell County Judge pursuant to Section 418.108 of the Texas Local Government Code on or about March 16, 2020, related to COVID-19.

Judge Haden reads the local Disaster Declaration order that is in place and due to the new developments this weekend recommends to reduce the mass gathering to 50 people and extend to 21 days out. Motion made by Commissioner Theriot, second by Commissioner Shelton. All voting "Aye".

JJ Wells added that it be clear that the amended order will supersede previous order. Judge Haden reads the amended order.

Commissioner Roland asked if order would pertain to entities such as churches and restaurants. JJ Wells responded, the language of the order can be amended by Commissioners Court if needed. Commissioner Roland agreed to keep order as is. Judge Haden added that other entities in other Counties are doing the same. He attended meetings with City of Luling and City of Lockhart which are planning on enacting on a similar order. JJ Wells explained that different municipalities within his jurisdiction can implement their own procedures.

Mike Lane asked if there was a confirmed COVID-19 case in the Caldwell County. Judge Haden confirmed there was no case in Caldwell County.
