BE IT REMEMBERED, that on the 14th day of November 2022, the Commissioners' Court of Motley County met in Regular Session in the Courthouse in Matador, Texas. Called to order at 9:32 am by Judge Meador, who then gave the invocation.

Also, in attendance were Tom Edwards CA and County Treasurer Misty Jones.

Public: Rusty Ethredge and Marisue Potts. No one signed up for public comment. No one present from TX DOT.

No. 461

Clerk Russell read the minutes from the Special Session held on October 3, 2022. Motion by Commissioner Campbell and seconded by Commissioner Cruse to accept the minutes as read and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote. Clerk Russell then read the minutes from the Regular Session of Commissioners Court held October $11^{\rm th}$, 2022. A motion by Commissioner Jameson and seconded by Commissioner Campbell to except the minutes as read and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote.

Judge Meador read the monthly reports to the court for the District and County Clerk, Extension Agent, Justice of the Peace, Library, and the Tax Assessor-Collector. Commissioner Jameson made the motion to approve the monthly reports as presented Commissioner Campbell seconded the motion and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote.

The outstanding bills were presented by County Treasurer Jones and reviewed by the court. Motion by Commissioner Jameson to approve the bills as presented, Commissioner Brooks seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote.

Judge Meador moved to item 8 on the agenda for the Public Hearing on the County designation of Steston Renewable Reinvestment Zone, establishing boundaries thereof and providing for an effective date, pursuant to Chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code. Many questions were asked of Attorney Guymon who was called by Judge Meador and put on speaker to answer questions.

After Public Hearing was done a motion by Commissioner Jameson to accept the Resolution designating Stetson Renewables Holding Reinvestment Zone, establishing the boundaries thereof and providing for an effective date, pursuant to Chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code, as it relates to the foregoing possible tax abatement agreements. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Brooks and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote. (Resolution in Abatement Folder)

No. 463

Next on the agenda was to discuss the Tax Abatement Agreement with Stetson Renewables Holding. After reviewing the information presented a motion was made by Judge Meador and seconded by Commissioner Jameson to approve the Tax Abatement Agreement, and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote. (Agreement in Tax Abatement Notebook)

No. 464

Item 11 on the agenda was Precinct 3's old motor grader. Commissioner Jameson stated he would like there to be as much information out there about the grader as we could do on the county website and such for taking bids. If he went to auction with the grader we would just have to take whatever we got. A motion by Commissioner Jameson and seconded by Commissioner Campbell to accept bids on the grader til December 9th with the court having the right to refuse and all bids and that the bids would be opened in Commissioners Court on December 12, 2022 and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote.

Judge Meador let the court know that the county allotment from TXDOT this year would be about \$11, 790.00. Judge Meador will email Chris Reed at the Regional Office when the commissioners decide what they what and if they are splitting between several precincts or if just one precinct would get the material.

No. 465

The holiday schedule was handed out for the County for the year 2023. There are 13 holidays. Motion by Commissioner Campbell and seconded by Commissioner Jameson to except the 2023 holiday schedule and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote.

The annual bond for the Tax-Assessor Collector is due and a motion was made by Commissioner Campbell and seconded by Commissioner Brooks to approve the bond and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote.

No. 467

The November 8, 2022 Election was canvassed and the approved Provisional ballot was opened, counted and added to the canvass. Motion by Commissioner Cruse and seconded by Commissioner Brooks to approve the canvass for the 2022 General Election and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote. (results attached to these minutes)

No. 468

Treasurer Jones presented the Investment Policy for review and renewal pursuant to 116.112 of the Government Code. Motion by Commissioner Campbell and seconded by Commissioner Cruse to renew the Investment Policy and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote.

No. 469

Next on the agenda was to consider some outdoor Christmas lighting for the courthouse. Some discussion was had as to what and where. Motion by Commissioner Cruse and seconded by Commissioner Campbell for up to \$1500.00 to be spent on lights for the courthouse, and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote.

No. 470

Approval for Cyber Security Training to meet State Mandate for 2023 was discussed and a motion was made by Commissioner Campbell and seconded by Commissioner Cruse to approve the training which has to be completed by July 30, 2023 and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote.

No. 471

Last item on the agenda was to discuss and take action on the American Rescue Plan Funds. The seconded half of the money has been received and its \$116,543 Motion by Commissioner Campbell and seconded by Commissioner Brooks for the money to be spilt 5 ways just like the first round between the general and the 4 precincts and the motion passed with a 5 to 0 vote.

There being no further business to discuss the meeting adjourned at 11:35 a.m. upon the motion by Commissioner Cruse and seconded by Commissioner Campbell, with a 5 to 0 vote.
