__6. Colorado County EMS 2019 annual report. (Furrh)

Michael Furrh, EMS Director since 2016, presented his Annual Report for 2019 and 2020 Strategic Plan. Increased Paramedics from (3) in 2016 to (26) now.

Through donations have purchased a 2019 Kawasaki Mule, which has helped us get access to individuals that an ambulance or other vehicles can't get to.

Recently we received Grant Funds to purchase a 14 foot Zodiac with a 40 HP Evinrude motor, which I will be sending (3) employees to New Braunfels for training.

In 2019 we did (817) Interfacility transfers.

With a generous donation for an ambulance from Splashway, an agreement was made between EMS and the waterpark, we were able to staff the truck and provide service throughout the summer.

Remainder of donation from Splashway was used to purchase AED's for placement at the Courthouse, Courthouse Annex, Colorado County Jail and Services Facility.

Funds from this Grant will be used again in 2020 to bring AED's to all JP Offices,

Precinct Barns and lobby of Sheriff's Office.

When notified help was needed when Hurricane Imelda hit landfall, our two team members were on the road within and hour.

We are very thankful for all the Grants and donations received.

Where there's a will, there's a way.

Judge Prause stated when you came on as a team, one of our goals was to have a paramedic on every truck, we have accomplished that. Another chief goal was to try and not miss anymore transfers from our hospitals and we have increased that from doing about 20% to huge numbers now. With everything else I commend you, I commend your exuberance and your willingness to adapt, and it is proven in the numbers, and from what I hear in the community, they appreciate this service and want this service to continue as it is, with new goals and better things to come.

Also adding the helicopter at the airport has helped tremendously. (See Attachment)



A Message from the Director

2019 started out busier than most other years. When April came around, in the back of my mind I thought we were going to hit 3,500 calls for service this year, and we came close. For a service of our size an increase in call volume by almost 500 calls is substantial. That equates to almost 1.5 more calls a day to our system.

2019 was also the year of stability in our certification levels. We added 3 full time Paramedics and it has definitely paid off. In the past we strived to have a Paramedic on every staffed truck. The inevitable was we still had Basic Life Support units from time to time. In 2019, we had a Paramedic on every truck 24/7/365 with the exception of only a handful of days. This is attributed to a few



different factors. One, we've recruited more part time Paramedics. Two, we have graduated more Paramedics that were already existing employees. We now have been able to obtain the goal of Mobile Intensive Care Units across the board for all of our cities and service are in Colorado County. We now have a total of 26 Paramedics as opposed to 3 in 2016.

WE as an organization are expanding to be recognized throughout our region and State. It's absolutely amazing to me how we went from being "Just another ambulance service" to the easily recognized group of **Emergency Medical Service** providers that we are now. This has been done with hard work from our staff and the administration. We have been to numerous conferences across the State to further expand our practice and learn so much from each and every one. I now have a role with the Texas EMS Alliance and will be co-hosting our upcoming conference in Marble Falls in 2020. This has put us on a state wide stage and we are now offering up our advice to other departments. We have also reached out to our local lawmakers over certain EMS issues throughout the year and it has been a pleasure working with them to resolve

issues at hand. 2020 will also see your CCEMS at "EMS on the Hill" day where we gather with State lawmakers to share ideas, problems and solutions.

This year we VASTLY IMPROVED our Clinical department. We added a training Captain to organize our employee files and he works closely with the Clinical Manager. Together, they have brought numerous high profile classes to Colorado County EMS. Some of these classes have attracted numerous other departments into our facilities to gain the knowledge, to take back to their organizations. We have worked very closely with PHI Med 7 on this front. They have provided and organized numerous training classes for us which greatly helps in the collaboration between our two departments.

New protocols. It doesn't sound like a big deal until you have to do research on patient treatment outcomes, new medication, collaboration with other agencies, meetings with our Medical Directors, meetings with staff, writing them and implementing them throughout the ranks. This project actually started in 2018 and took almost a year and a half. It was finalized and put into place in April of 2019. Since then, we

have introduced some clinical treatments that aren't being done in any other service in our region of Texas. This is a HUGE and MAJOR accomplishment for our clinical manager, clinical department and our service. The real winners of these protocols are our patients that we treat day in and day out. Our team also received some new apparatus in 2019. In January, we took delivery of our newest Ford Transit ambulance. These have proven to be our long distance workhorses. We already have approximately 50,000 miles on the newest one and they have saved us fuel and maintenance costs since implementing them into our fleet. Also, we added a 2019 Kawasaki Mule in the first quarter. We are especially proud of this because this project was funded totally off of donations. No tax money was spent on the purchase of this equipment. It is used for football standbys, large gatherings such as the fair, and the rescue of individuals that cannot be accessed by an ambulance or bigger vehicle. CCEMS remounted a Frazer ambulance as well and placed a 2019 Ford F-450 chassis underneath it. It currently is serving as our Medic 1 and is based out of Columbus. Lastly, we received grants funds to purchase a 14 foot Zodiac with a 40 HP Evinrude motor. Also, no tax payer dollars were spent on the purchase of this equipment as well.

Morale goes up and down with any organization. I am happy to report to you, however, that our morale continues to stay on an upward trend as it did last year. We've added more full time positions at the beginning of the year which allowed us to be a little more consistent in our daily operations. We received a remounted unit and implemented more training. The general trend in 2019 is that we all realized that we ALL must give something to make this organization what we want it to be. With giving the crews a little more responsibility and some individuals even more, coming to work seemed that much easier for most.

To add to the previous paragraph, we really began to see employees take more ownership. Any time I speak to our employees or in town at functions, I always refer to this service as theirs. It belongs to the employees and their vision, just as much as it does mine. I am simply here to keep it in bounds and offer my support for the programs or equipment they would like to see. This, like said previously, gives them ownership as it should be.


We continued with our public relations this year and continue to provide community CPR. We have seen these quarterly classes go from 5 in attendance to upwards of 25. We have phone calls all the time wanting us to host classes. The more people we have trained in CPR throughout the county is the better success rates we will have with cardiac arrest patients. Along with community CPR it is our continued success with social media. CCEMS has over 5,000 followers who stay up to date with our organization. I grew up in a time that I had to "learn" how Facebook and how social media works. Most people born after me grow up knowing it. We have followers from all over the State, county and world and we find it the perfect platform to

disseminate important information quickly as well. This ultimately is a service that our citizens pay for, and I find it completely appropriate to open the doors and show them what we are doing.

2020 will mark my $4^{\rm th}$ year here with Colorado County EMS and since being here, this job has proved both challenging and rewarding. Personally, I wouldn't change it for the world. I have learned so much from being able to be afforded this opportunity to lead this organization and its 50 employees. I have personally have seen my up's and downs but continue to push through. Being a rural EMS Director is a very fluid job and requires many hats.

Something can be said for the leadership of the County as well. Judge Prause, the Commissioners and the County Auditor have been nothing less than supportive. They have personally mentored me and it is great to work with such a dedicated group of individuals who put the County first.

We all have a HUGE responsibility to keep our County on the right track and keep our citizens safe. I am truly humbled to be able to take part in doing just that. We have built a team at CCEMS that I personally would put up against any other service in the State of Texas. We can only improve as time goes on. We have the right people in the right places and we all appreciate the trust you put into myself, the employees and our organization.



2019 AT A GLANCE

The Department of EMS and the Command staff of Public Safety Professionals responded to an increase in emergencies and IFT's (Inter-Facility transfers) for the third year in a row. This year, we averaged almost 68 IFT's per month. We also increased our total calls for service by 452.

The Department handled 3,469 responses in 2019. This was a 15% increase from 2018.

\$1,600,692

With the highest revenue from fees for service in our history, 2019 increased revenue over 2018 by \$376,551. These yearly increases (3 years consecutively) aren't easy to come by and takes a lot of work from both the crews and administration.

The EMS department had success with billing throughout the year of 2019. We have (and will always) continue to critique our report writing and timely submissions of our run reports to billing. We continuously strive for excellent report writing and have been blessed enough to have good EMS neighbors to offer guidance in this area. Close collaboration with our billing company and continuing education couples with %100 quality assurance on reports have paid off. We are still trying to overcome the hurtle known as the Texas Ambulance Supplemental Payment Program (TASPP). Michael will continue to work with State elected officials to make sure this program stays in place. Rural ambulance services are a necessity and should be treated as such when it comes to fair compensation from the State and Federal governments.

When it comes to revenue, it has always been a personal goal to not have the county pay for more than half of what we spend throughout the year, to operate. There may be a time where we miss the goal, but rest assured, we will work diligently to make it. This is the third year in a row that we have seen increased collections and it can only be contributed to the hard work of our employees. The following are a few positives and negatives that we worked through, throughout the year.

Lots can be said of our organization in the way we operate as lean as we do. As you will see from some of the numbers on the next page, we continue to decrease the amount that each registered citizen could expect to pay towards EMS per year. This is a HUGE accomplishment. I'm a taxpayer just like you are. Everything that EMS has done has been for the betterment of the organization, the citizens or the employees. There are a plethora of different models that a county could provide when it comes to EMS. However, our 3rd service County funded model by far is the way to go. The EMS system is easily motivated by the counties elected and appointed officials and we always put our citizen needs first.

We have taken another year to continue to fine tune the way we write reports. Through constant communication with our billing company, we will always have room for improvement. Medicare guidelines change as well which we always have to stay abreast of. Continued education of the hospital staff throughout the county helps as well. We are required to have certain paperwork to file when taking transfers. They are always willing to help if this step was overlooked during the emergency transfer

process of a patient.



Through 2018 we saw a reduction in trips being sent back needing additional information and a lower turnaround time on items needed for billing. This resulted in claims being paid faster when appropriate and increased revenue's year over year for Colorado County EMS. This is a testament of our partnership and your ability to drive Key Performance indicators in the right direction.

EMS | MC will have a new tool in 2019 at your disposal that will aid in looking at crew level detail on items that matter most to billing. Our "Crew Analysis" will help to aid in further lowering these figures by letting you monitor and coach to items such as clean claim rates, patient demographic information and others. — Seth, EMS MC

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REVENUE SOURCES

A DETAILED EXPLANATION OF THE MULTIPLE **FUNDING STREAMS THAT THE EMS DEPARTMENT RECEIVED IN 2019**

"Fees for service", otherwise known as insurance money, is the primary and most fundamental revenue stream that funds the EMS Department. It's funding sources FY19 also the most fickle. Easily swayed from year to year and significantly affected by Health Care Reform and the ACA (Obama Care). As the Administrative assistant for the Department, Dinah Janak oversees the daily operations of fiscal management. Her extensive knowledge in billing practices and her over 20 years' experience as a county employee makes her extremely valuable in this position. In 2019 we received \$1,600,692 in revenue from fees for service that was deposited to the County from EMS. This is 100% from insurance companies, Medicare/Medicaid and private payments. This does change annually, but roughly 55-60% of our total revenue is based on Medicare revenue.

As mentioned above, we had some difficulties registering with TASPP (Texas Ambulance Supplemental Payment Program) and at the time of this report, we are hearing that we are about to be approved to participate in it. This program enables us to receive collections from a portion of Medicaid and private payers that do not compensate us for our service. By speaking to numerous EMS Directors



from our area who participate, this has been a great program that they will continue to participate in as long as it exists. It is also a data collection initiative and when your

OVER 1.7 million from all

Grants and donations have been a great help with this department and our success rate. In the course of three years 2016-2019 we have received over \$400,000 from numerous private and public grant funds as well as private donations. In 2019, we received almost \$140,000 in donations. 
Inter-facility Transfers

IFT's: A COMPARISON OVER THE PAST FEW YEARS

In the beginning of 2016 Colorado County EMS was at a bit of a crossroads when it came to providing transfer services to our hospitals. From a few different perspectives, transfers clearly are the continuation of care from Colorado County. They bridge the gap from our local facilities to the larger facilities in Houston, San Antonio and Austin. I still feel as if we should continue them both from a medical standpoint and a revenue standpoint. IFT's compose almost 1/3 of our income. We continued to improve our methods and the amount of transfers we were able to facilitate. We concentrate primarily on our local facilities and we do occasionally get requests from Lavaca and Fayette County and will facilitate those IF we can. The year of 2017 we averaged in the mid 40's for transfers a month. In 2018 we averaged 56 which equates 1.85 a day and now in 2019 we averaged 68 which averages to 2.23

We continued to use our Ford Transit throughout 2019 for our IFT's and we continued to see success from a fuel mileage standpoint. We also added a Transit to our fleet for a total of 2. I have also received compliments from patients on the smoothness of the ride. Having them for more than





two years now, we are still averaging a solid 16 miles per gallon compared to 7.6 in the F-450. It is quite a bit smaller, thus easier to maneuver in city traffic. It also serves as a good, solid back up unit for 911 calls. The oil changes and maintenance of the Transit is substantially less and are done in house. It took a while for the crews to get used to it, but they now enjoy it and compliment them all the time. Having two Transits in our fleet has allowed us to keep one in Columbus and one in Eagle Lake to service CCH and Rice Medical Center.

By continuing this vital role for the citizens of the county, we will continue to provide the patient care for as long as possible. From the initiation of the 911 call to the transport to the most appropriate facility.



With right at 3,500, that represented a near 15% increase over 2018. Any increase is a significant increase on systems operations. However, one must understand that the amount of responses is not the primary factor dictating the growth of the Department. It's the ability to handle that volume that must drive the operational performance and any changes to a system. Throughout 2019, our call volume fluctuated month to month, but ultimately ended up being a little over 290 more which is almost 3 more request per day. As mentioned previously, you actually noticed an uptick in our transfers as well.

In 2019, we continued to service Splashway

but in a different capacity. With the generous donation of an ambulance from Splashway and an agreement made between EMS and the waterpark, we were able to staff the truck AND provide first aid for the park throughout

the summer. This project was done because both Splashway and EMS envisioned a need for the waterpark and the surrounding areas. This project was also completed without any taxpayer dollars and offered our employees and extra job within our county ultimately continuing to serve our citizens and visitors on their days off.

report writing system. EMS spent 309,970 minutes assigned to calls for service with an average of 89.3 per call. This was up from 2018 by 104.079 minutes.

Throughout the year the majority of our patients are taken to either Columbus Community Hospital or Rice Medical Center. This year, we transported 805

patients to CCH and 170 patients to RMC. These numbers are down slightly from last year, however, we are also doing a better job of taking our patients to the right hospital the first time. We have learned more and more what the capabilities of our local facilities are, and do not burden them with patients that they cannot handle. Therefore, patient get taken to Katy, West Houston, Rosenburg, Sugar Land or downtown Houston straight from the scene of the call.

This was another successful year of cooperation between EMS and all types of entities. We received more donations and grant funds from people and organizations than any previous year.



We received Southeast Texas Regional Advisory Council (SETRAC) all precinct barns and another in the lobby of the Sheriff's Office.



funds and a portion of them were used for some equipment that was needed on the new Splashway unit, and the remained of the funds were used to purchase AED'. In 2019, we were able to place an AED at the Courthouse, the Courthouse Annex,

Courthouse Annex, the Colorado County Jail, and the Services Facility. The funds from this grant will then be used again in 2020 to finish the project, ultimately brining AED's to all JP offices,

Our relationships with our volunteer fire departments continue to grow and continue to be on the forefront.



Clinical Operations

CLINICAL UPDATE 2019

The Department remains committed and focused on improving patient outcomes, decreased morbidity and



mortality for the nearly 1,000 square mile service area. 2019 was a year of new beginning and additions to protocols. We added a few IV pumps to more of our ambulances so we now have pumps on all trucks in our fleet for IV medication infusions. Our Clinical Manager, Guy Minshall, has worked tirelessly to bring us updated protocols. Working together Guy, Dr. Molina, myself and the crews, we now have cutting edge protocols in Colorado County and rival the more progressive services. We have treatments in our new protocols that no other service in our region has, furthermore, bringing better care to the patient's bedside in their time of need.

I believe nothing is more important that setting accurate expectations for our EMT's and Paramedics. Dr. Molina has been a great asset in reviewing reports and meets with command staff when needed. We also gained an Assistant Medical Director, Dr. Thomas and he has been a pleasure to work with. His main goal is to fill the gap in case of Dr. Molina not being present or on vacation. We also added Dr. Van Houten and Dr. Cantu to our MD arsenal. Our Clinical Manager, along with our

Captains and FTO's, have completed the initial Field Training Officer program and we continue to have our quarterly CE classes.

In late 2019, we applied for a grant through the Stanzel Foundation to replace some aging mankins with a "smart" manikin. With their help if awarded, we will be able to have a full body manikin that we can train



on with multiple scenarios. This manikin will also be able to travel and we can then take it from station to station and train with the crews that are stationed in Eagle Lake and Weimar.

With PHI in such close proximity to us now, we find ourselves training more and more with them both on and off calls. They have never hesitated to help up with training and offer us any class that is at their disposal. We will continue to take them up on those offers as it only makes our system that much stronger! In 2019, we had around 5 different classes that they were able come teach and we packed the house every time with our personnel and personnel from surrounding agencies.

Every day we train, we improve.

2019 Employee retention report

We hire those who want to be more than the minimum....

Like every year, staffing a Public Safety Department is difficult even during the best of times. The current lifespan of a Paramedic career is approximately four (4) years, when you look at national data. This means the typical individual who graduates from Paramedic school is expected to remain in the profession for approximately four (4) years. This is in large part due to the mental stress and anxiety placed on these individuals. The Department recognizes this and understands that for most employees, EMS will not be a career. However, in the past year and a half, we have made great strides to improve morale and improve retention through training, pay, benefits and equipment. We have also come to terms of the challenging market we deal in. Gone are the days of the volunteers in EMS (for



the most part). The thing that most people don't understand about EMS, is it is no longer the "ambulance driver"

EMS their profession, so we must do what we can to compete with other agencies in our area. We essentially bring the



that comes to pick you up. We have highly skilled, highly trained personnel. EMT's go to school for an average of 4-6 months while Paramedics are in school for an average of 2 years. Most Paramedics have intentions of making

emergency room to the field and are the last true service that offers "house calls". While retaining employees has been a huge victory of the recent past, we continue to struggle with finding qualified and capable Paramedics for the work force.

The Department has been keeping a close eye on one unique factor affecting us. As more and more universities assume control of the Paramedic education programs, we continue to see a major difficulty in getting recent graduates cleared to practice medicine within the Department. Our findings is that the more education the Paramedic candidate has does not automatically translate to a better clinician. In the past years, we would clear a Paramedic in just days and expect them to fully function on their own. Now, it could take upwards of a couple of weeks to even a month or two. We are not in the business of setting someone up for failure, especially when it is lives that we deal with.

To recap, CCEMS staffs 4 Mobile Intensive Care Unit ambulances 24/7/365 out of 3 stations and during the summer months, we staff another ambulance from 9:30 to 6:30 7 days a week. Those stations are located in Columbus, Weimar and Eagle Lake and Splashway Waterpark. We currently employ 26 Paramedics and 28 EMT's and out of those, 21 are full time personnel. We do all of this with a budget of roughly \$2,410,850 with revenues at \$1,600,000 so the total cost to provide 1 ambulance in Colorado County a year is \$159,744.



Neighbors to the North

Our neighbors to the North staff 4 Mobile Intensive Care Unit This is approximately \$282,631 more than Colorado County.



ambulances and have a shift supervisor on a Squad 24/7/365. It is unknown exactly how many full time employees they do employ, but their 2019 budget was \$3,269,501 with their total revenues being budgeted for 2019 at \$1,500,000. Their cost to provide 1 ambulance per year is in the neighborhood of \$442,375.

Neighbors to the East

Our neighbors to the East supply 3 Mobile Intensive Care Units for their county out of 4 stations. They also employ a supervisor on duty in a Squad. It is also unknown how many full time employees they have but their 2019 budget was \$2,435,896 with their total revenues

being budgeted for 2019 at \$800,000. Their cost to supply 1 ambulance per year is in the neighborhood of \$545,298.

This is approximately \$385,554 more than Colorado County.

These are simple figures between each organization by taking the allotted budget and subtracting the revenue then dividing that by how many ambulances are staffed. Obviously each organization, their calls for service, demographics and divisions within the departments are different from service to service. However, our main goal in Colorado County EMS is to provide ambulance services with other divisions falling 2^{nd} to that.

All in all, our organization would hope that the commissioners and the county's citizens would be very pleased with these figures when comparing our EMS to others that surround us.




Hurricane Imelda Deployment 2019

CCEMS was contacted the night before Imelda's landfall to deploy through the Southeast Texas Regional Advisory Council which was requested by the State of Texas. Our deployment was solely based off evacuation of stranded patients in nursing facilities or hospitals. Our organization belongs to a division of SETRAC know as the

Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF) and are subject to State deployments year round. This is a way that Colorado County can give back to the region when other communities need us most.

Immediately after being contacted, I notified our two team members (Josh Lopez, Paramedic and Jerald Krenek, EMT) and they were on the road to east Texas within an hour. They stayed deployed for almost four days with minimal sleep and had numerous impacts on lives located in the





Lumberton area of SE Texas. This has quickly turned into an interest from numerous employees and 2020 will be filled with EMTF meeting, and more involvement within that division. When activated, these are state funded

deployments meaning that the State reimburses the County for our employees' time and any backfill that incurs due to the employees being deployed.

It's no secret in emergency services that since Hurricane Harvey, the county was in need of rescue operations that are available to everyone in every community. EMS took that topic seriously and began the groundwork for a Special Operations Division within EMS. This made sense to us on so many levels, but the first being that our department is staffed 24/7/365 and can be available for immediate deployment. We now had the idea, the personnel



and the outlet for training, we needed funding. At the beginning of 2019, we applied for a grant through LCRA for funding of a boat and was unsuccessful. Through determination, we applied again to LCRA later on in the year, and were successful! Our matching portion for the grant was paid for out of our donation line item, therefore, NO TAX payer money was used on this project. We took delivery of our new 14 foot Mil Spec Zodiac in December 2019. We went to Kemah and were welcomed for almost 3 hours at Triad Marine. While there, we received training and field repair instructions on the new boat. They are the sole source of

these type of boats that are also used for Texas Task Force 1, so to our organization, it was a no brainer. 2019 we finished with ropes training and 2020 we are starting our training our strong and partnering with Washington County EMS on our new adventure. They have been instrumental in helping us and will continue to do so throughout our beginnings.


2020-1 STAFFING


Our Department has several planning initiatives surrounding staffing. First and certainly foremost is the wellbeing and staffing retention of the Department's 20 full time employees. This has remained our objective since I came to Colorado County. We cannot afford to lose focus on the most important asset we have, our people. Without them nothing is achievable. Several key issues were noted throughout the last 2 years in reference to staffing.


- Ensure that we continue to have appropriate staffing levels to continue the equality of care to the citizens of Colorado County.
- Ensure that salary surveys are done regularly throughout the year to ensure that we are able to keep up with and compare to our "competitors."
- For 2020, we will request an additional 1 EMT and 3 Paramedic spots. With this move, we will be staffing 4 trucks 24/7 with FULL TIME Paramedics and EMT's as well as provide a supervisor on a Squad that is available to respond to emergencies around the county and take on their assigned tasks more easily.
- CCEMS will also be doing salary surveys so we can stay in line with the departments that surround us. By doing this, our recruitment and retention efforts will remain stable.

We have slowly transitioned the EMS Department from a majority of part time employees to a majority of full time employees. By continuing to do this, we create more accountability for our organizations. Throughout 2018, the amount of "call offs" from our part time personnel was astonishing. We ended up using more overtime than expected. With the slow transition to more full time, we have seen the call off's take a drastic turn downwards.

2020-2 Fleet Planning

Covering 1,000 square miles isn't a job that most services have to be tasked with. With our increasing call volume, it makes sense to continue a replacement plan with our vehicles that keeps a newer fleet response ready. Of course, we have suffered break downs and we have even suffered break down while patient loaded, but we quickly move the patient to another ambulance and continue the transport. This is a big reason we prefer to keep a newer fleet, if possible. It all comes down to the patient. By providing a comfortable, reliable ride to the hospital, the patient satisfaction is greater and could actually contribute to a better patient outcome.

2020-3 Maintenance

The EMS Department continues to do most of it's maintenance in house. Most oil changes and general maintenance are done by Capt. Silver at Station 1.

In 2019, Steven went from being on a truck to coming off for a trial period of 6 months. He now works Monday through Friday 8-5 and is on call on the weekends. Numerous times throughout the year he has also responded with me in an ambulance when we are at level XERO in the county (No available ambulances). Steven has saved the service money and continues to do so while also covering call off shifts from time to time. His job description has a mission but he is also a certified EMT, therefore, he can be fluid in his daily duties. In 2020, he was promoted to Captain and is now in charge of all the Special Operations Division as well.

2020-4 IMPROVE DATA COLLECTION AND **OPERATIONAL ANALYSIS**




Throughout 2019, we worked on multiple data points throughout out system ranging from chute times to cardiac arrest treatment and interventions. All of them encompass both the operational and clinical side of EMS.

A big project for 2020 is the communication between our cardiac monitors and our iPads that we use to write our electronic patient care reports. By doing this, it saves time and curbs inaccurate information being placed into the ePCR. Providers are able to upload their vital signs and EKG reading into their report via Bluetooth which also saves time from the Administrative Assistant from scanning and attaching this information to ever report we do in the field. We will

2020-5 is one of the initiatives we have been working on for some time now and will always continue. This is also a strategic plan that will probably never come off the report. We have been successful in obtaining grants for our department throughout the course of the last few years. However, there are more grants out there. With our proximity to the railroad(s) throughout the county and having a major thoroughfare through our county (I-10), this opens the door to different types of grants.

As stated above, we are always very thankful and appreciative of the grants we have received from all the numerous donors and organizations. These grants have paved the way for us to be able to receive vital equipment that is needed for us to preform our jobs. And again, just because we are rural, doesn't mean we have to settle. To me, it actually means the complete opposite. Our EMT's and Paramedics take care of patients for longer periods of time than most other services out there. They are challenged with critical patients like no other. So I only feel it to be fair that we try our best to equip them the best possible way we can.



OBJECTIVES

The goal of this Emergency Operations Plan is to provide the following:

- A safe and secure working environment for all election workers.
- Emergency procedures for all election workers
- A means of communication between election workers and the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office.
- A means of communication between elections workers and emergency personnel.

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Part 1 Life Safety

COMMUNICATION

- The Presiding Judge is in charge of the election workers, equipment and voters located at the polling location per the Texas Election Code Sec. 32.071. In the event of an emergency situation, he/she will notify 9-1-1 if necessary, and the Colorado County Election Administrator. The Judge may designate an election worker to communicate with other emergency personnel and the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office with reliable and accurate information.
- 2. The Colorado County Election Administrator will assume the role of chief communicator to the news media for election issues. The Colorado County Election Administrator's Office shall maintain an up-to-date list of news media to be contacted with regard to the election process or in a crisis situation. The Colorado County PIO has the sole responsibility to provide all media and public information for any information outside of the election process.
- 3. Colorado County Election Administrator staff and election workers at the polls: If contacted by telephone or at the scene of a crisis by the media, direct them to the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office. Do not release the name(s) of victim(s) or details of the event until proper authorization from the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office has been issued.

If pressed for information, simply state that policy requires you to direct all media requests to the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office.

In the event of an emergency, the following actions should be taken:

- 4. ALWAYS RESPOND TO THE EMERGENCY. If first aid or emergency personnel are warranted, the election judge should take the necessary steps to handle the situation. Ask another election worker to dial 9-1-1 and/or notify the Elections Office. The injured person should never be left unattended by election workers
- 5. NOTIFY THE FAMILY. If a family member cannot be reached, a message should be left if an answering machine is available. The Elections

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staff should continue to try to reach next of kin at 5-minute intervals until someone is reached.

6. NOTIFY ELECTIONS OFFICE. The next call should be to the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office. Questions about the presence of emergency vehicles on site may come into the elections Office and the staff needs to be updated periodically on what is happening. The Colorado County PIO will update media.

LOCK DOWN

In the event of a violent or threatening situation, initiate and implement lock down procedures.

In the polling location:

- 1. Voters should stay inside the polling location.
- 2. Lock doors and cover windows.
- Move all election workers and voters to an interior wall away from windows and doors.
- 4. Take a count of persons inside the polling place. Report this number to the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office of where and how many people that are sheltering-in- place by phone call or text message if possible.
- 5. Stay put until notified that lock down is terminated.

NOTE - All Election staff must wear identification badges at all times per the Texas Election Code Sec. 61.010(b)

WEAPONS

Sec. 46.03. PLACES WEAPONS PROHIBITED. (a) A person commits an offense if the person intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly possesses or goes with a firearm, knife, club, or prohibited weapon (2) on the premises of a polling place on the day of an election or while early voting is in progress;

 Call 9-1-1 and report the presence of the weapon. Give a good description of the armed person: gender, approximate age, physical characteristics, clothing type and color, type of weapon, and where the armed person was last seen with direction of travel if available.

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- 2. Notify the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office that there is suspicion of a *gun in possession* on site.
- The Judge will determine if lock down procedures or evacuating procedures are to be implemented.
- 4. If law enforcement determines evacuation is necessary, immediately evacuate the area of the building concerned.
- Advise all election workers and voters to make no attempt to disarm the individual.
- 6. Turn situation over to law enforcement and offer assistance as needed.

SHOOTING

- 1. Follow the above guidelines, administering basic first aid until health care professionals arrive.
- 2. The Colorado County Election Administrator, working with law enforcement, will make all decisions and arrangements to file necessary charge(s) against person(s) involved.

BOMB THREAT

Bomb threats may be originated in writing, in person, over the phone, email, or through a second source.

- 1. The Presiding Judge or designee will call Law Enforcement @ 9-1-1.
- 2. Notify the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office 979-733-6860.
- 3. The Presiding Judge or designee should initiate a **visual** search by all election workers for any foreign objects. Do not open any drawers, doors or cabinets. If anything suspicious is found, **DO NOT TOUCH IT.**
- 4. All election workers should remain in polling locations.
- 5. Do not use cell phones or radios at any time as they may trigger a device.
- 6. Law Enforcement will determine if the building should be evacuated.
- 7. It may be necessary to evacuate election workers and voters at least 300 feet away from the building.

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- 8. "The building is clear" message from law enforcement will inform election workers and voters when the building is safe and voting may resume.
- 9. A written report shall be submitted to the Colorado County Election Administrator by the Presiding Judge.

GAS LEAK

Natural gas can occur inside or outside of a building. The potential hazards of a gas leak are fire, explosion, carbon monoxide poisoning, and suffocation. You should suspect a gas leak if you smell a very unpleasant odor, like that of rotten eggs. "Mercaptan" is added to gas to let you know that a leak exists.

For All Gas Leaks

- 1. If the smell of gas is strong, *evacuate* the building using emergency evacuation procedures.
- 2. Call 9-1-1 from outside the building. A cell phone may generate a spark that could trigger a fire or explosion. State the emergency situation.
- 3. Contact the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office.

EVACUATION

First Actions in case of fire or other emergency

- 1. The fire alarm will ring. Evacuate the polling location of all election workers and voters.
- 2. Call 9-1-1.
- 3. Do not take personal belongings or election voting equipment.
- 4. If it does not cause a life safety issue, take the ballots.
- 5. Once out of the building, proceed to designated area, make note that all elections workers and voters have left the building.
- The Presiding Judge or designee will be in charge of the election workers and voters.

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7. Call the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office.

In the event that a polling location needs to be evacuated (flooding, chemical spill, explosion, etc.), the Presiding Judge will notify the election workers and voters to evacuate the area and to leave the location and proceed to a location to be determined at the time of the event.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

Direct Contact

- 1. Evacuate the area to avoid fumes.
- 2. Call 9-1-1
- 3. Remove contaminated clothing and flush the area with cold water for fifteen (15) minutes. If flushing the eye area, position the flow into the eye while holding the eyes open.
- 4. Notify the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office.

Indirect Contact

- 1. Call 9-1-1
- 2. Call the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office. 979-732-6860.
- 3. The Colorado County Election Administrator's Office will contact the Presiding Judge if evacuation from the polling location is necessary, and will direct the Judge on where to relocate.

Identify the Spill to Emergency Personnel with the Following Information

Product number, Manufacturer information, Product contents/ingredients as given on container (whenever possible, spell the names to avoid misunderstanding). Volume of spill/exposure, Reactions on surface/individuals, Product contamination with other chemicals.

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INFECTIOUS DISEASES (GUIDELINE FOR CLEAN UP)

All body fluids should be treated as if they contain potential infectious agents.

- USE OF GLOVES: Vinyl, latex, or rubber gloves shall be worn by any
 caretaker when cleaning up blood spills, vomit, urine, feces, or other
 secretions. Gloves shall also be worn when removing any body fluid spills
 from the environment (e.g. furniture, floors, rugs, etc.).
- HAND WASHING: Hand washing after contact with an individual is
 routinely recommended. In the case of accidental contact with blood, hands,
 and/or affected skin areas should be washed immediately. Proper hand
 washing requires the use of soap and warm water and vigorous washing
 under a stream of running water for approximately ten (10) seconds. A
 waterless hand rinse should be used when running water is not available.
 OSHA 29CFR1910, 1030

NOTE: Any potential infectious exposure (direct contact with body fluids, blood, vomitus, etc) should be immediately reported to the Chamber County Public Health Department for guidance on disinfection, cleanup of contaminated equipment, disposal of waste materials and proper decontamination of persons, as well as any post exposure prophylaxis (PEP) OSHA 29CFR1910, 1030

- CLEANING METHODS: Soiled environmental surfaces should be promptly cleaned with a freshly prepared household chlorine bleach solution (1:10 dilution). Apply a disinfectant absorbent agent to soiled rugs, allow to dry, sweep up with a dustpan and broom, and follow with a disinfectant rug shampoo applied with a brush. Using fresh bleach solution, soak mops, brooms, and brushes for ten (10) minutes. Other cleaning equipment should be thoroughly rinsed in fresh bleach solution. Washable clothing should be presoaked and washed separately using one-half cup chlorine bleach per wash cycle
- DISPOSAL OF MATERIALS: Clothing and other non-disposable
 materials that are soaked with body fluids should be placed in plastic bags
 and instructions for handling given to appropriate persons. Disposable
 towels, tissues, gloves, and cleaning supplies should be used whenever
 possible, and should be placed in a plastic bag, securely tied and to be
 disposed of. Used cleaning solutions should be flushed down a toilet.

INJURY

- 1. Call emergency personal at 911 if needed.
- 2. The Presiding Judge will notify the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office.

WEATHER CLOSING

Most weather closings of the County will occur overnight, however, a few may occur during the day.

- Colorado County Election Administrator's Office staff, election workers and voters, may be reminded to listen to local radio stations and television stations for weather closing announcements.
- Colorado County Election Administrator's Office staff will be informed of all weather closings by the Office of Emergency Management and the Code Red system.
- The Colorado County Election Administrator will notify all Election Judges of any closings of polling locations and Judges will then notify Alt. Judge and clerks during any election.
- The Colorado County Election Administrator is solely authorized to close polling locations, delay openings, or accelerate the end of voting.

WEATHER EMERGENCY

In the event of a major weather related situation and it has been determined that any of the polling locations cannot be opened or staffed, the following procedures will be followed.

During a Weather Emergency

- If a weather emergency is given, the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office will notify the polling location, and whether the polling location must be closed.
- If the location is to be closed, the Presiding Judge will announce, "At this time, we are implementing inclement weather procedures."

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- Allow any election workers or voters to leave the polling location.
- If it does not create a life safety issue, lock and seal all electronic voting machines, document the seal numbers and take all written election materials. Do **not** take electronic voting machines. Turn out the lights, close and lock the door upon leaving your polling location.

If it is possible to return to the polling location, wait for instructions from the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office.

FLOODING

- The Presiding Judge should be attuned to available media for possible flash flood warnings and flooding progress.
- Be prepared to move from danger quickly if required.
- Watch for flooding in highway dips, low areas and around bridges near your polling location.
- Watch for signs such as thunder, lightning, or distant heavy rainfall.
- Contact the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office for further instructions including evacuation orders. If you must leave and can safely complete the following: If it does not create a life safety issue, lock and seal all electronic voting equipment, document the seal numbers and take all written election materials. Do not take electronic voting equipment. Turn out the lights, close and lock the door upon leaving your polling location.
- If it is possible to return to the polling location, wait for instructions from the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office.

POWER FAILURE

Power Failure

- 1. Call the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office and notify of the power failure.
- Inform the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office of the situation.
 In the event the telephones will not operate, send someone to Colorado County Election Administrator's Office for assistance.
- 3. If there is a danger of fire, evacuate the building by evacuation procedures.

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TORNADO

Tornado Watch

A tornado watch is declared by the National Weather Service. Tornado Watch means be prepared. Tornadoes are possible in the watch area. (NOAA) Generally speaking, signs which precede a tornado include one or more of the following: severe lightning, destructive high winds, heavy rains, large, heavy hail.

Report immediately any of the following to Colorado County 9-1-1:

- 1. Funnel shaped, rotating clouds.
- 2. Protuberance(s) or rotary motion at the base of a thunder cloud system.
- 3. Any rotating cloud of debris or dust near the ground.
- 4. If it is too dark to see, listen for any distinctive roar similar to an aircraft or train.

Tornado warning

A tornado warning is declared by the National Weather Service. This condition occurs when a tornado has been reported in the area and there is imminent danger to life and property.

- If a tornado is spotted or reported in your area, sound the alarm immediately.
- Move everyone immediately to a safe place.

Do not leave a building except to go to a pre-designated, safer building unless instructed to do so by civil authorities in charge. Keep abreast of who these civil authorities might be (police, fire department, etc).

If a tornado is spotted or reported as being imminent, assume disaster drill position (sitting, knees up, head down and hands locked, covering the head). If outside and unable to reach shelter, escort voters to a ditch or hollow and have them lie face down with hands over head.

Post-Tornado

- If a tornado passes without striking you, be cautious, as there may be other funnels in the area. Usually, however, more than one tornado does not occur in the same general path following the initial tornado.
- If your building is struck by a tornado:
 - Call 9-1-1.
 - Administer first aid to personnel if needed
 - Evacuate damaged area cautiously to designated staging area(s).
 The injured should be moved as little as possible. All injuries should be noted, and all missing should be noted.

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 Notification of all damaged equipment and buildings, and those who have been injured should be made to the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office.

Part 2 Election Emergency Plan

If any significant emergency event occurs in which an Election Day polling location is unavailable and the voting equipment and supplies are damaged, then an Emergency Plan will be instituted.

The Presiding Judge and the Colorado County Election Administrator will determine the severity of the situation. The Secretary of State will be advised of all emergency situations. Only the Governor or County Judge can postpone an election in a disaster or emergency.

The Colorado County Election Administrator will request the County Judge to activate a limited Emergency Operations Center to support the Colorado County Election Administrator with securing the resources and coordination required to reschedule and or relocate an election. All communications to the media and public will be issued from this Office or from the Colorado County Public Information Officer. The following procedures will be followed:

- 1. All Emergency personnel will be contacted, including the Sheriff, Emergency Management, etc.
- 3. The regular Early Voting location that has been designated by the Commissioner's Court will become the Emergency Election Day polling location or any other location as designated by the Election's Administrator. Election Officials at each polling place will post the address of the election day polling location when moved.
- 3. All election workers will be notified to determine if they can safely travel to the Emergency Polling locations.
- 4. Emergency voting supplies will be distributed to the Emergency polling location

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Emergency Supplies

The following supplies will be distributed to each Emergency polling location:

- All unused Early Voting Ballots designated as "Emergency Ballots" will be in secure transport containers
- 2. Pre-locked, numbered, sealed, and secure ballot box
- 3. Voting Booths
- 4. Paper copy of voter registration list, if possible
- 5. Signs stating "EMERGENCY VOTING HERE"
- 6. Table and chairs if needed
- 7. All other election supplies needed to conduct an election

OPENING THE EMERGENCY POLLING LOCATION

Once the emergency polling location has been established including any lighting or electricity needs, the Colorado County Election Administrator or designee will proceed with the opening of the emergency polling location and notifying the public in coordination with the OEM.

The Presiding Judge and election workers will prepare the polling place for opening as follows:

- 1. Set up tables and voting booths.
- 2. Post "EMERGENCY VOTING HERE" signs in places visible to the voting public.
- 3. Prepare Emergency Ballots for use
- 4. Prepare all election materials for use

Use paper copy of voter registration list provided by Colorado County Election Administrator's Office. If that is not available, then voter must present voter registration card. If the voter does not have his/her card available, then Provisional Ballot material will be used.

CLOSING THE EMERGENCY POLLING LOCATION

Since voting will be done on paper Emergency Ballots, the following procedures will be followed:

- 1. The Presiding Judge will complete all election forms and paperwork.
- 2. Voted **Emergency Ballots** are sealed in a pre-locked, number sealed and secure ballot box.
- 3. All signs are removed from areas around polling location and location is secured.
- 4. All **Emergency Ballots** in the locked ballot box and election materials are returned to the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office at the Colorado County Courthouse.

VANDALISM

Procedures for building vandalism

CALL 9-1-1

- The Colorado County Election Administrator's Office should be notified IMMEDIATELY as to the kind, extent, location and approximate time the damage was incurred.
- DO NOT OPEN THE POLLING PLACE TO THE VOTERS
- Before law enforcement arrival, the building space affected should be sealed
 off by appropriate means and all items in the affected area must be left intact
 for possible law enforcement investigation procedures.
- Within the limitations of the above, all possible efforts should be expended
 by building personnel to make emergency repairs to items deemed dangerous
 to persons or property within the building.
- The Presiding Judge should make a record of the type and extent of damage to the building and its contents, including election equipment and supplies.
- The Presiding Judge and the Colorado County Election Administrator will determine if any cleanup is needed.

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- Proper maintenance personnel will be called if building damages need immediate repair.
- The Presiding Judge and the Colorado County Election Administrator will
 note all pertinent information on a burglary/vandalism report, with a copy
 forwarded to law enforcement for proper evaluation.
- If it is determined that the building is not safe for voting to continue, then the Emergency Plan will be instituted.

LOITERING OR ELECTIONEERING

A person commit an offense, if during the voting period and within 100 feet of an outside door through which a voter may enter the building in which a polling place is located, the person:

Loiters; or electioneers for or against any candidate, measure or political party

When person(s) are suspected of loitering or electioneering pursue the following

procedures

- The Presiding Judge shall inform the person of the distance markers and prohibited area.
- Ask the person to move to an area outside of the prohibited area.
- If they refuse to leave, remind him/her that they are in violation of the law and that law enforcement may be called.
- If they still refuse to leave, contact the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office. The Colorado County Election Administrator will advise in-route activities.
- Remember, the Presiding Judge cannot enforce any electioneering if the person is outside of the restricted area.

Transportation Issues

If the Presiding Judge or Alternate Judge is transporting election equipment to or from the Colorado County Courthouse and has vehicle issues, such as a flat tire, ran out of gas, in a vehicle accident, contact the Colorado County Election Administrator's Office. Call 9-1-1 for accidents and then call us! Secure all equipment. Relocate equipment if it poses a danger (off to the shoulder of the road, etc). Make sure both judges witness all actions involving the equipment.

The Colorado County Election Administrator's Office will determine how the election equipment will be retrieved from the two judges.

A written report shall be made by the Presiding Judge and signed by both the Judge and Alternate Judge and given to the Colorado County Election Administrator after the incident is clear.

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PLAN FOR OPERATION OF CENTRAL COUNTING STATION

Preparation:

- Perform the second test count.
- Assign functions to personnel.

Receipt of Ballot Boxes(Transfer Cases) from Precincts: (# Personnel: 1 or 2)

- Examine each ballot box to insure that they are properly sealed and verify seal numbers.
- Receive the DS200 Flash Drive from the ballot box and hand them directly to the Tabulation Supervisor.
- Inspect ballot box for proper envelopes (1, 2, and 4) and any other necessary paperwork and transfer to the Bag Check-In Worker.
- Once contents of ballot box are verified and paperwork and DS200 Drive is removed hand box to the Ballot Sorter.

Bag Check-In: (# Personnel: 1 to 2)

- Receive the supply bags from the Check-In Judge.
- Verify the numbered envelopes (1, 2, and 4) have proper paperwork.
- Sort the rest of the supplies into their respective boxes for review and inventory (may be done next day).

Ballot Sorter: (# Personnel: 1 to 2)

- Remove ballots from boxes to be sorted and straightened.
- Place into marked bags to be stored in sealed ballot boxes.

Station Manager / Assistant:

- Remove provisional ballot envelopes, if any, and verify that number of envelopes corresponds to number of voters shown on **list of provisional voters**.
- Record number of provisional ballots on summary of provisional ballots.
- Check for spoiled / damaged ballots in their respective folders for review by ballot board.
- Monitor and assist the Bag Check-In crew as needed.

Tabulation Supervisor / Assistant:

- Process DS200 Flash Drives through the ES&S Computer Software and tabulate the results as they come in.
- At the conclusion of the evening after all precincts have checked in, the Tabulation Supervisor then prints the results.

Colorado County Elections Department 1/24/2020

Administrator:

- Submits the electronic tabulations for precincts to the Secretary of State.
- Prepares print out of results as needed.
- Officiates all the paperwork and signs the original print out of results.

Conclusion:

- When all precincts have been accounted for, print results and ready the equipment for the use of the ballot board to verify mail voters and perform the **third test count**.
- Ensure all ballot boxes are sealed correctly and securely.
- Make sure the Administrator has a copy of the printed out results.

*Note: Some persons may perform more than one roll.

Agreement

In exchange for the issuance of a permit by Colorado County to perform the work described on the Application, Applicant agrees to comply with the following provisions:

- 1. Applicant shall pay a permit, inspection and document review fee of \$1,000 for the Oil & Gas industry and \$100 for all other types of right-of-way permits and a fee of \$500 for each open cut of a County Road if that procedure is approved by the Precinct Commissioner.
- 2. Applicant expressly recognizes that the issuance of a permit by Colorado County does not grant any right, claim, title, or easement in or upon the road or its appurtenances. In the future, should Colorado County, for any reason, need to work, improve, relocate, widen, increase, add to, decrease, or in any manner change the structure of the road or right-of-way, the line, if affected, will be moved, or relocated at the complete expense of Applicant.
- 3. Colorado County, its employees, agents or assigns will be held harmless for all claims, actions, or damages of every kind and description which may occur to or be suffered by any person or persons, corporation, or property by reason of the performance of any such work, character of material used or manner of installation, maintenance or operation or by improper occupancy of rights-of-way or public place or public structure, and in case any suit or action is brought against Colorado County for damages arising out of or by reason of any of the above causes, Applicant, is successors or assigns, will upon notice to him or them of commencement of such action, defend the same at his or their own expense, and will satisfy any judgment after said suit or action shall have finally been determined if adverse to Colorado County.
- 4. Colorado County, its employees and agents will, at no time, be held liable for any damage or injury done to the property of Applicant whether in contract or in tort, which may result from improving and/or maintaining its county roads or right-of-ways.
- 5. The Applicant must provide three copies of drawings or diagrams showing proposed location of the utility, pipeline, communication line, electrical line, or telephone line (hereafter "utility") with respect to right-of-way, type of installation or repair, size, length, material, and size of appurtenances, if any.
- 6. The construction and maintenance by Applicant shall not interfere with a previously installed utility. When necessary to remove or adjust another utility, a representative of that other utility shall be notified to decide the method and work to be done. Any cost of temporarily or permanently relocating other utilities shall be borne by Applicant.

- 7. If Applicant is installing a pipeline across a county road, the pipe shall be encased from right-of-way line to right-of-way line. Vents will be provided at each end where the length of casing is over 150 feet. All vents shall be placed outside county road right-of-way. Readily identifiable and suitable markers shall be placed at the right-of-way line where it is crossed by the pipeline.
- If Applicant is installing a pipeline along the county road right-of-way it shall be located
 as close as possible to the right-of-way line as specified by the Precinct Commissioner.
 Readily identifiable and suitable markers shall be placed along the pipeline every 1,000
 feet.
- 9. Applicant agrees to haul heavy loads or equipment to the work site along routes designated by the Commissioner of the Precinct in which such roads are located and Applicant, further, agrees to reimburse the County for any and all damages to roads and bridges in Colorado County from the movement of said loads or equipment within 30 days of receipt of County's notice of damages.
- 10. The Applicant shall make every effort to open and close all trenching operations during the daylight hours of one day. Appropriate measures shall be followed in the interest of safety, traffic convenience and access to adjacent property for all trenching operations. It shall be the responsibility of the Applicant to adhere to the section on construction and maintenance as outlined in the Texas Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices.
- 11. All lines, where practicable, shall be located to cross roadbed at an approximate right angle. No lines are to be installed under or within 50 feet of either end of any bridge. No lines shall be placed in any culvert or within 10 feet of the closest point of same.
- 12. Parallel lines will be installed as near to the right-of-way line as possible, and no parallel line will be installed in the roadbed or between the drainage ditch and the roadbed without special permission of the Precinct Commissioner.
- 13. No work shall be performed in the County right-of-way until after a permit has been issued by the County. Each permit will be valid for a period of 180 days. If construction has not been completed within this period, a new permit must be obtained.
- 14. The Applicant or its Contractor shall have a copy of the executed Application, Agreement and Permit available on the job site during the duration of the work.
- 15. All lines shall be buried at least forty (40) inches below the lowest point of the roads, ditches, creeks or borrow pits.
- 16. All open cut excavations of a county road shall be no greater in width than is necessary to adequately install the utility line.

- 17. Operations along roadways shall be performed in such a manner that all excavated material be kept off the pavement at all times, as well as all operating equipment and materials. No equipment or installation procedures will be used which will damage any road surface or structures. The cost of any repairs to road surface, roadbed, structures, or other right-of-way features as a direct result of this installation will be borne by the Utility.
- 18. Upon completion of the project, all equipment, construction material, surplus materials, trash, broken concrete, lumber, etc. shall be removed from the construction site. The entire construction site shall be graded and cleaned to present the appearance as it was prior to construction or better.
- 19. For utility lines crossing under a County road or private entrance, Contractor shall be required to drill, core, or bore through the sub-grade at a depth to be determined by the Precinct Commissioner. If, however, such procedure is deemed impractical by reason of rock, utilities, underground construction or terrain, special permission shall be obtained from the Precinct Commissioner before an open road cut will be allowed. If approved, trenching, backfilling, and resurfacing of the cut shall be done in accordance with the procedures outlined in this Agreement. The Applicant shall be responsible for all paving repair for a period of one year after completion.
- 20. Backfill requirements for all open cut excavation and trenches shall be as follows:
 - Areas not subject to or influenced by vehicular traffic- the trench backfill shall be placed in layers not more than ten inches (10") in depth, and shall be compacted by whatever means the Contractor chooses.
 - ii. Areas subject to or influenced by vehicular traffic- the trench backfill shall be mechanically compacted in six-inch (6") lifts to a minimum of ninety percent (90%) modified proctor density.
 - 1. <u>Dirt Roads</u>- Backfill shall be well tamped in six inch (6") layers to a point nine inches (9") below the surface of the road, after which one-foot (1') of good gravel shall be tamped until level with the existing surface.
 - 2. <u>Gravel Roads and Streets</u>- Backfill shall be well tamped in six inch (6") layers to a point nine inches (9") below the surface of the road after which one foot (1') of good gravel shall be tamped until level with the existing surface.
 - 3. <u>Asphalt Roads</u>- Backfill materials shall be selected mineral aggregate and cement in proportions of 27 to 1, properly compacted (tamped to proper density of 90%) to within two inches (2") of road surface. Asphaltic concrete must then be added and tamped or rolled to make a level surface with existing road surface.

- 21. The Applicant shall not cut or open more than one-half of the roadway at a time, in order to maintain the flow of traffic at all times. However, in an emergency or with the permission of the Precinct Commissioner, the total width of the roadway may be cut or opened, provided barricades are placed at the first intersection each way from the cut, and suitable detour signs are erected.
- 22. All of the above work shall be done under the direction of, and be satisfactory to, the Precinct Commissioner. The holder of the permit shall notify the Precinct Commissioner twenty-four (24) hours prior to the time the work will be done, to allow the Precinct Commissioner to be present at the time the work is done. This will in no way relieve the Applicant from its responsibility for maintenance due to failure of the repaired cut.
- 23. Failure to Comply with Specifications: If an opening or cut in the county right-of-way is not refilled and restored as herein provided, the County will notify the Applicant in writing to refill and restore the opening to the satisfaction of the Precinct Commissioner. If the Applicant fails to comply with the written request within ninety (90) days after receipt of such notice, the County is authorized to disable or remove the utility from the right-of-way and Applicant will pay for any expenses for the refilling and restoration within thirty (30) days after notice of the amount by County. Failure to refill, restore, or pay will authorize the County to collect using the Performance Bond. No further permits shall be issued to such Applicant until these costs have been paid.
- 24. An opening or cut in a county road that is not refilled and restored within 24 hours following verbal notice to applicant by Precinct Commissioner will be repaired by County and Applicant will be billed for the cost of repairs. Failure to pay this bill will authorize County to collect the bill using the Performance Bond.
- 25. In the event that the Applicant or its successor(s) abandons the utility, Applicant shall give written notice to the Colorado County Judge, P.O. Box 236, Columbus, TX 78934.
- 26. If the utility is abandoned or at the expiration of the use of said utility, Applicant will timely remove the utility from the county right of way. In the event said utility is not removed, ownership of the utility will vest in County. It is agreed that "timely removal" of said utility shall be within 120 days after said utility is abandoned or use expires.
- 27. 





- 4. Colorado County, its employees and agents will, at no time, be held liable for any damage or injury done to the property of Applicant whether in contract or in tort, which may result from improving and/or maintaining its county roads or right-of-ways.
- 5. The Applicant must provide two (2) copies of drawings or diagrams showing proposed location of the utility, pipeline, communication line, electrical line, or telephone line (hereafter "utility") with respect to right-of-way, type of installation or repair, size, length, material, and size of appurtenances, if any.
- 6. The construction and maintenance by Applicant shall not interfere with a previously installed utility. When necessary to remove or adjust another utility, a representative of that other utility shall be notified to decide the method and work to be done. Any cost of temporarily or permanently relocating other utilities shall be borne by Applicant.

- 7. If Applicant is installing a pipeline across a county road, the pipe shall be encased from right-of-way line to right-of-way line. Vents will be provided at each end where the length of casing is over 150 feet. All vents shall be placed outside county road right-of-way. Readily identifiable and suitable markers shall be placed at the right-of-way line where it is crossed by the pipeline.
