Notice is hereby given that the McCulloch County Commissioners Court will attend and participate in a Senate Committee Hearing (Senate Committee on Business and Commerce) on Wednesday July 29, 2026 at 9:00 AM. The meeting will be held at the Capitol Extension Hearing Room E1.012 in Austin, Texas. The following subjects will be discussed to-wit:

Discussion Items

1. The McCulloch County Commissioners Court will participate in discussions / offer testimony in relation to ONCOR Electric Delivery Company's and LCRA Transmission Service Corporation's proposed routes for the Bell County East Switch to Big Hill Substation 765 kV Transmission Line Project as it may traverse McCulloch County.

The Interim Charge for the Senate Committee is Copied and Pasted below:

Managing the Impacts of 765-kv Transmission Lines on Private Property Rights: Review the proposed 765-kv transmission line route plans to determine their impact on homes, businesses, and communities. Assess whether the current regulatory processes and timelines are sufficient in protecting landowner rights, including allowing for proper consideration of the effect of high voltage transmission lines on long-term land use, property values, and environmental factors. Recommend ways to improve transmission planning, permitting, and siting decisions for the infrastructure necessary to serve growth in the state.

Although a majority of the Commissioners Court may be in attendance, it shall be noted that NO ACTION or VOTE will be taken by the Commissioners Court on any County related business that may be discussed and no record will be made or kept.

Sec. 551.0035. ATTENDANCE BY GOVERNMENTAL BODY AT LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE OR AGENCY MEETING.

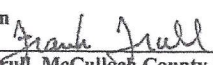
(a) This section applies only to the attendance by a quorum of a governmental body at a meeting of a committee or agency of the legislature. This section does not apply to attendance at the meeting by members of the legislative committee or agency holding the meeting.

(b) The attendance by a quorum of a governmental body at a meeting of a committee or agency of the legislature is not considered to be a meeting of that governmental body if the deliberations at the meeting by the members of that governmental body consist only of publicly testifying at the meeting, publicly commenting at the meeting, and publicly responding at the meeting to a question asked by a member of the legislative committee or agency.

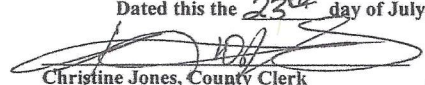
