PRESS RELEASE, FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: IMPACT OF COVID-19

Current Situation: At least 410 new coronavirus deaths and 19,322 new cases were reported in Texas on Jan. 28. Over the past week, there has been an average of 17,159 cases per day, a decrease of 25 percent from the average two weeks earlier.

As of Friday morning, there have been at least 2,330,107 cases and 36,434 deaths in Texas since the beginning of the pandemic, according to a New York Times database.

The Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) is currently reporting a total of 2,018,127 cases of COVID-19 in the State of Texas which includes an estimated 364,220 active cases. 1,894,564 individuals have recovered from the virus and 35,639 confirmed COVID-19 related fatalities. Across Texas, a total of 16,949,139 COVID-19 molecular tests have been completed. DSHS is also reporting, Texas has received and distributed a total of 3,163,450 doses of COVID-19 vaccine.

Texas Division of Emergency Management

The Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) is currently reporting a total of 7,253 cumulative tests have been administered in Presidio County. As of January 29th, 2021, the total number of confirmed cases is 580, with 98 Probable cases.

Texas continues to receive doses of the Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines, and is distributing statewide to hospitals, pharmacies, local health departments, freestanding ERs and other clinics.

Who can get the vaccine now?

Front-line healthcare workers and residents at long-term care facilities (called <u>Phase 1A</u>) plus people over 65 or with a chronic medical condition that puts them at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19 (called <u>Phase 1B</u>) are currently eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine.

DEADLY CONDUCT - TEXAS PENAL CODE 22.05 (a)(e)

Deadly Conduct is a crime defined in the Texas Penal Code under Chapter 22.05. This crime is committed when one recklessly engages in conduct that places another person in imminent danger of serious bodily injury.

PLEASE TAKE THIS VIRUS SERIOUSLY, PROTECT YOURSELF AND OTHERS, WEAR A MASK, WASH YOUR HANDS AND KEEP 6FT DISTANCE.
