

The Commissioner’s Court of McCulloch County met in Regular Session on the 11th day of May 2026 at 9:00 a.m. with the following present:

BILLS:

Bills for May 11, 2026, were presented and approved with corrections. Commissioner Deans made the motion and Commissioner Maricle seconded. All in favor Motion carried. 5-0

Elected Officials/Department Heads: Commissioner Deans reported that recent storms have caused issues with the County's repeater system, with both the north and south repeaters intermittently going offline. He also reported that he purchased 100 traffic cones at a cost of \$5.00 each. Commissioners interested in purchasing cones for their precincts were asked to contact him. Commissioner Deans further reported that there is a broken window on the third floor of the west side of the courthouse.

County Treasurer Mikkie Williams reported that the CSLFRF report has been completed. She reminded the Court that all CSLFRF funds must be fully expended by December 24, 2026.

Commissioner Anderson reported that the County has received the closeout documents for FEMA Disaster 4416.

County Judge Frank Trull reported that the Concho Valley Council of Governments (CVCOG) received five responses to the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for the Outdoor Warning Sirens SB3 Grant planning and evaluation project. Judge Trull stated that he, Judge Corbin, and Judge Rose will serve on the interview panel and will make recommendations to the CVCOG Executive Committee regarding the finalists for selection. He also informed the Court that McCulloch County will need to complete separate procurement processes for both grant administration services and the contractor responsible for construction of the project. Judge Trull further reported that John Boyd with Boyds of Texas is scheduled to visit on Wednesday to conduct a preliminary assessment of the repairs needed for the courthouse roof and gutter system. He also noted that Boyds of Texas is in the process of becoming a BuyBoard vendor.

Discussion:

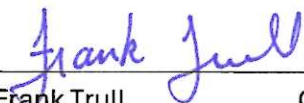
1. Frontera Healthcare Network representatives addressed the Court and provided informational updates regarding the services they offer to residents. Services include assistance with Medicare and Medicaid enrollment, SNAP benefits, and mental health services. Representatives explained that patient fees are based on a sliding fee scale determined by income. They also reported that they are working with Congressman Pfluger to pursue grant funding to help reduce the cost of services for patients.
2. The Court discussed the replacement of the telephone system and related equipment at the Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office is interested in transitioning to Broadvoice as its telephone service provider. Chief Deputy Jason Corbell stated that Snider IT, the County's IT provider, has been involved in the planning process and would assist with the

transition should the project move forward. Chief Deputy Corbell stated they they have the funds available in the current budget to cover the project.

3. Sheriff Matt Andrews presented the need for a new computer software system for the Sheriff's Office. He explained that the department would like to transition from Kologik to E FORCE because the current Kologik system is unable to generate the state reports required for submission. The proposed E FORCE system would better meet the department's reporting and operational needs. The total cost is \$148,257.93 (installation) with \$24,494.22 per year. \$50,000.00 to start with the \$98,000.00 upon completion. Chief Corbell stated that they have the 50,000.00 in current budget to begin.

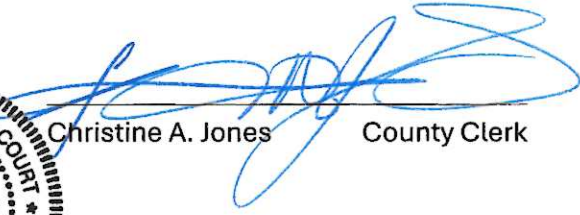
Action:
